irst Reading: Micah 5:1-4a

Living at a time when the people of Israel were surrounded by foes and ruled by corrupt kings, the prophet Micah declared that a just king would be called forth from Bethlehem, the hometown of the mighty King David. This passage reminds us Christians of Jesus, the shepherd king whose coming promises a reign of peace for the world.

econd Reading: Hebrews 10:5-10

For several weeks in October and November, we heard excerpts from the Letter to the Hebrews that was written after the destruction of the Temple in the year 70. This letter speaks of Jesus using the image of the high priest. Today's second reading returns to that theme, noting that, for Christians, temple sacrifices are embodied in Jesus' sacrifice on the cross.

ospel: Luke 1:39-45
The season of Advent draws toward its climax with today's Gospel reading. The final words of the passage are especially important for us today. Do we, like Mary, trust in the Lord's words to us?

THE VISITATION: THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

. . Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Luke 1: 39-45)

Christmas is this week!

Our Gospel today shows us Mary visiting Elizabeth, her cousin. Mary is carrying our Savior in her womb and Elizabeth, her elderly cousin, is pregnant with John the Baptist. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

In just a few days you and your family will gather to celebrate another Christmas. May it be a warm and festive time for your family.

And may it be an especially happy time for the Elizabeths in your clan: the mothers and sisters and cousins and aunts who are always the first to come to the aid of a family member in need, who instinctively know the right and encouraging thing to say in times of sorrow, of mourning, of trauma — and who know that sometimes the best thing to offer is simply to listen quietly. Our blessed "Elizabeths" have been there and have seen it all; their advice is always spot on; they maintain a sense of optimism and hope no matter what; they inspire by the quiet,

humble peace of their lives and radiate joy by their very presence.

Mary's cousin Elizabeth is that kind of blessing for her family. Her joy and trust in God enables her pregnant teenage cousin to realize and embrace what God has called her to

do. It's easy to imagine that today's Gospel is not the only time the two cousins will meet and talk as they raise the sons God has entrusted to them. So, as your family prepares to gather next week, give thanks to God for the Elizabeths among you — and let them know how much they matter to you. And may each of us, in our own way, become an Elizabeth for those we love. (Connections)

JOYFUL RECOGNITION

Elizabeth recognized the divine significance of Mary's visit because of the Holy Spirit. In the Spirit Elizabeth proclaimed Mary's greatness and called her blessed. Mary was also praised because of her trust in God's word of promise.

Adults: How has the Holy Spirit stirred me to recognize God's presence?

Children: What can I learn from Mary's visit to Elizabeth?

A Family Perspective: The theme of the season of Advent is sometimes described as a period of waiting for the birth of Jesus. However, today's Gospel reading suggests something different. John the Baptist did not tell the crowds to wait for the Messiah. He told them to prepare for the Messiah through acts of repentance. If Advent is a time of waiting, it is not the sitting in the doctor's office kind of waiting. It is a busy time of preparation, more like the waiting we might do when preparing for dinner guests. Our challenge is to not make this season a frenzied time, but rather a time of joyful anticipation and making ready for God who comes to dwell among us and changes our lives with the gift of salvation. As you gather as a family, work together on a word search or hidden-picture puzzle. Help one another until everyone has found each of the words or pictures in the puzzle. Talk about this experience, noticing how some people found words or pictures more easily than others and how easy it was to see the word or picture once someone else pointed it out. Observe that sometimes we need the help of others to recognize God's presence and action in our lives. Read together today's Gospel, Luke 1:39-45. Ask: What did Elizabeth recognize about Mary? How did Elizabeth know this? Pray together that as we share our faith together as a family, we may help one another recognize God's presence and action in our lives. Pray together the Hail Mary.


