#### irst Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1,6-7,10-13

In our first reading, the prophet Samuel searches among God's people for the next person to be king. He learns that God's choices do not conform to superficial human expectations or prejudices. Is this a lesson we need to learn as well?

#### econd Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

This portion of an early Christian letter instructs believers that God desires behavior based on goodness and justice.

G ospel: John 9:1-41 When the Gospel of John was written, sixty years after Jesus' ministry, Jewish members of John's church had recently been barred from synagogue This situation is evident in the membership. comments made about the parents of the blind man whom Jesus heals in this Gospel passage. Angry at those who caused the expulsion, the Gospel writer depicts the Pharisees as more blind than the formerly sightless man. The anger in this passage would prompt us to reflect on times when we have been blind, when we have failed to see God at work in unexpected people and places.

#### THE MAN BORN BLIND AND LAETARE SUNDAY


# The healing of the man born blind: "Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him . . . " (John 9: 1-41)

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called *Laetare Sunday* because the Opening Antiphon begins with the words, "Rejoice Jerusalem!" Today we have the beautiful story about the man who was born blind who is healed by Jesus; this changes his life forever. It demonstrates to us how God can draw good and blessings from bad and wretched circumstances. God draws near to us always, especially when we are suffering. Here is a reflection I'd like to share with you.

C.S. Lewis once wrote a story about how God suffers with us in silence by telling a story of World War II. C.S. Lewis talked about his time as a medical aid during the air war over London, with the bombing raids and dogfights. A little girl, perhaps four or five years old, was brought into the makeshift first-aid station badly hurt, in the arms of her father who was crying with the daughter. The doctor on duty quickly knew the problem; he knew that to save the child's life she would have to lose her leg through amputation. The doctor insisted that the man place the girl onto the table so they could saw it off before she died from her bleeding wound. Lewis told of the excruciating pain in the father's eyes as he laid his daughter onto that bloody table and pried her little hands off, one finger at a time off of his coat sleeve, about how that father with all love and tears flowing held her down to this table, this torture while she screamed in pain and agony as the doctor cut away at muscles and bones and flesh, so that she might have life.

God loves us, Christ has shown, just as a father loves his own children. Sometimes, sometimes, God grieves with us, and our screams of pain and fear and hatred pierce right into his heart. God understands when in pain we cry out 'Why, oh why, God?' God instead calls back to trust and know that we are still loved. And that even in the pains of this world we live through it with God beside us so that we might have life eternal. (Kirk Griffin, "Why, Why, Why)

#### I WAS BLIND AND NOW I SEE

Some of us suffer from spiritual blindness. We waste time judging and criticizing others because they do not see things the way we do. We even blame people for their sufferings and believe that God is punishing them.

Adults: Do I consider illness and suffering punishment for past sins?

Children: Do I criticize my friends or family and say nasty things behind their backs?

Family Perspective: When infants are baptized, parents, with the help of the godparents, assume responsibility for raising the child as a follower of Jesus. The process of maturation in the faith is much like the example found in the story of the man born blind. The man is cured of his blindness, a symbol of his sin. Each time he meets someone after the healing, the man comes to a deeper awareness of who Jesus is. In a similar way, we who are baptized continue to mature in faith as our relationship with and knowledge about Jesus grows. Invite each member of your family to draw a timeline of his or her life. On the timelines, ask family members to identify significant moments in their lives, especially their life of faith. Invite each person to reflect upon who Jesus was to him or her at each significant moment. How has each person's relationship with Jesus changed or matured?

Fall Semester August 23-December 16. Ps 101 General Psychology 3 credits.






#### OBERAMMERGAU WITH MSGR JOHN HART JULY 18 - 30, 2022

Deepen your Lenten experience and join us for this spiritual event. Nightly Topics will be:


