

WE ARE THE SALT OF THE EARTH

"You are the salt of the earth . . . You are the light of the world." (Matthew 5: 13-16)

Jesus continues his Sermon on the Mount and teaches us that we are called to be salt and light.

Herman Cruse drives a school bus in Cape May, New Jersey. His young passengers love "Mr. Herman"— and with good reason.

One morning, Mr. Herman noticed that a kindergartner on his bus seemed a little sad. He asked what was wrong. The boy told Mr. Herman that he wasn't able to complete his reading assignment because his parents were busy with his four siblings at home. It was hard to find one-on-one reading time with his busy mom and dad.

Mr. Herman said, "Listen, I have some free time, and if you don't mind, I'd like to come to the school and read with you." So, with the permission of the six-year-old's teacher, Mr. Herman began coming to her kindergarten classroom. The bus driver and his young friend went to a quiet corner and began to read to each other. "So he read to me, I read to him and we read together, and from there it took on a life of its own," Mr. Herman remembers. "A second student wanted to read to me, then a third. All these kids were going to the teacher asking, 'Can I read with Mr. Herman?'"

That was two years ago. Now, two days a week, Mr. Herman spends the four hours between his morning pick-up and afternoon return drives working with kindergartners and a third day with the school's first- and second-graders. His reading circles have been dubbed "Mr. Herman's Kids."

Kindergarten teacher Alex Bakley says of her "reading assistant": "Herman is goofy, silly and super positive and the kids love him. He's a bright light at our school and makes every child feel loved and heard — they're drawn to his energy."

Mr. Herman sees his new challenge as a natural extension of his work as bus driver. "Bus drivers are the eyes and ears of students when they're away from home. We have an uncanny gift to discern what kids are feeling. "It's a joy to see the kids get excited when they learn to sound out words," the 55-year-old Cruse, the father of five grown children, says. "They feel a sense of pride. I love how reading opens up a new world for them. I feel lucky to see that firsthand.

"What started out as a way to kill time has now blossomed into a way to make a difference in the heart of a child." [The Washington Post, December 7, 2022; NJ.com, December 19, 2022.]

"Mr. Herman's Kids" mirror Jesus' challenge to let the light of God's wisdom shine forth in the simplicity and hiddenness of our everyday lives, to refuse to allow the light we possess — and the light possessed by others — be diminished or extinguished because of fear, isolation or pride. Every one of



us has the ability to be "salt" that can enrich our world with compassion, forgiveness and joy; every one of us possesses "light" that can eradicate the darkness of fear, hopelessness and injustice. But fear and doubt can lead us to keeping our light hidden — or worse, we can force the brilliance of others to remain hidden, as well. May we realize Jesus' challenge to be "salt" for the earth: to make God's presence and grace realities in our own time and place; to be "light" for the world: to illuminate the dark, hopeless corners of our world with justice and hope. THE DISCIPLES OF JESUS - A MOVEMENT TRANSFORMING THE WORLD

The world and our very lives are often complicated, challenging, and beset by troubles of various kinds. In all of this, people of faith find their hope and direction in Jesus and his proclamation of the coming of the Kingdom of God.

Adults: When Jesus tells me that I am salt and light in this world, what new thing do I understand about myself and fellow believers?

Children: How can I bring the light of Jesus to my family and my friends?

A Family Perspective: The widespread use of electricity in our society may make us less aware of the value and importance of light. To re-engage with the power of the metaphor that Jesus offers, gather your family in a darkened room. Bring only one flashlight. Sit together for a minute and consider what you are able to do and see in so little light.

Read today's Gospel by the light of the flashlight. Ask everyone to consider what it means to say that Christians are to be the light of the world. How might your family act in a way that is a light for others, a light that is worthy to put on a lamp stand? Choose one thing that your family will do this week to show that you are the light of the world.

In the home: Ask family members to consider and pray over how your home can be a light in this world, a beacon of hope.

In the workplace or in school: Identify one way in the workplace or in school that would contribute to a more reconciled environment and do something to bring it about.


