irst Reading: Acts 2:42-47


Throughout most of the year the first reading comes from the Hebrew Scriptures, but during the Easter Season it is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. That book is the second volume composed by the writer of the Gospel of Luke. It was written around the year 85, fifty years or so after the formation of the first church community in Jerusalem. Today's excerpt tells about that first church.

C econd Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

For the next several weeks our second reading will come from the First Letter of Peter. It is uncertain whether Peter himself wrote this letter shortly before he died around the year 65, or if it was written in his name by disciples after his death. In either case, the letter contains important early Christian insights into the meaning of Jesus' death and Resurrection. Today's passage teaches that belief in the Resurrection of Jesus brings the promise of birth into a glorious new life.

🛂 <u>ospel: John 20:19-31</u>

Today's Gospel reading, the story of doubting Thomas, is thought by many to be the original conclusion of the Gospel of John. If so, then the Gospel's final words pose a challenge to us—the Gospel's modern readers.

SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY

Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you . . . "
[Thomas] said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

John 20: 19-31

On this Sunday within the Octave of Easter, we see how the Risen Lord gives his gift of peace to his disciples. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

This is our fourth Easter season in the age of COVID. Things are certainly better now than that first terrifying Easter in 2020 that seemed like a never-ending Good Friday of fear, isolation, grief and death. We seem to be, finally, on the Easter side of the pandemic.

But we're all too aware that things will never be the same again. We know that "normal" will never be like it was four years ago. The threat of COVID will remain with us for a long time. The immune-compromised among us will continue to be cautious and anxious — masks will still be worn; care will be taken before going to crowded indoor events.

The pandemic has left permanent scars on all of us. Some scars are physical scars from the illness itself; some scars are the emotional scars of helplessly watching a loved one suffer and die. These scars have made us different people in many ways — good ways, we pray: the scars of COVID have made us more aware of the fragility of life; the scars of COVID have made us more attuned to the suffering of others; the scars of COVID have made us more grateful for the dedication of those in medicine, public health and safety; the scars of COVID have made us more responsive to our responsibility to one another as neighbors, citizens and children of God.

COVID has been a cross our human family has borne, a cross that has taught us all a great deal about Jesus' spirit of selflessness and humility that leads us to the God of resurrection.

When Thomas refuses to believe, Jesus invites him to touch his wounds, to probe the marks of the nails and touch the scars on his body. Jesus' scars are signs of his presence among us still despite our frail humanity. They are also signs of God's compassion and peace in the midst of our own crucifixions, reasons for hope despite the weight of the crosses we bear. We

all have wounds and "nail marks" that are signs of wisdom and hope that can only be realized in brokenness, in suffering for the sake of another, in pain endured in our own crucifixions. This Easter, may our COVID "scars" and hurts mirror the "scars" of the body of the Risen One, empowering us to bring comfort, healing and justice to our Good Fridays. (Connections)

COINCIDENCE AND THE HOLY SPIRIT

"Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." We recognize Christ's presence in the signs around us, since we cannot see him directly.

Adults: In what events in the last week am I able to recognize the presence of God's Spirit in my life? How is the Spirit leading me?

Children: Do I realize that the Spirit of Jesus is always with me? Do I take time to listen to what the Spirit is asking me to do?

A Family Perspective: Many of us can relate to Thomas's response to the news that the disciples had seen Jesus. We want to see for ourselves too, but we grow in faith, trusting the experience and knowledge of others. Many of us have heard the saying "Seeing is believing." As your family gathers, take some time to consider what that saying means. What are some things we believe because we see them? Is there anything we believe without seeing? Today's Gospel reminds us that faith sometimes asks us to believe things we cannot see with our eyes. Think about Thomas's response to the reports about the risen Lord. Is Thomas's doubt reasonable? How does Jesus respond to Thomas?

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

During the course of Jesus' revelations to Saint Faustina on the Divine Mercy He asked on numerous occasions that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. The liturgical texts of that day, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, concern the institution of the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of the Divine Mercy, and are thus already suited to the request of Our Lord. This Feast was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina on 30 April 2000. In a decree dated 23 May 2000, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments stated that "throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come."

Concerning the Feast of Mercy, Jesus said: Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. (*Diary*, 300)

I want the image solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it. (*Diary*, 341)

Please join us on Sunday, April 16 for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 2:30 p.m., the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00 p.m., and Benediction at 3:30 p.m.. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered from 3:30 - 4:30 p.m.
