In this reading from the Hebrew Bible, Isaiah of the Restoration proclaims God's generosity to those By bringing the returning from exile in Babylon. exiles back home, all the nations of the world will witness God's glory. They will stream to Jerusalem to pay homage to the God of Israel and of the whole world.

C econd Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6

In this portion of his letter to the Ephesians the writer explains that through Jesus, Gentiles have now become honorary members of God's people, along with the chosen people, the Jews. A saving relationship with God has now been extended to all the world, through Christ.

ospel: Matthew 2:1-12

Magi were the royal counselors of the emperors of Persia and studied what today might be called "the occult." by describing the visit of three of these officials to Bethlehem, Matthew reveals that even pagan Gentiles are affected by Jesus' birth. Furthermore, the magi's gifts, items used at the burial of a king, suggest that the child's importance involves his death.

EPIPHANY

[The magi] were overjoyed at seeing the star and on entering the house, they saw the child and his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. (Matthew 2: 1-12)

Today we celebrate Epiphany, (the word means "manifestation"). As we recall the adoration of the Magi during this Christmas liturgy we are reminded that God wants to reveal His love to all people. Jesus Christ is born in time not only as the Savior of Israel; He is the Savior of the whole world and God wants everyone to know this. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy

Netflix is currently airing a four-part adaptation of Anthony Doerr's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel **All the Light We Cannot See**.

The heroine is 16-year-old Marie-Laure, the blind daughter of the widowed master locksmith at the Museum of Natural History in Paris. Marie-Laure loses her sight at the age of six due to congenital cataracts. Her father is determined that his beloved daughter will not live a life of self-pity, so he teaches her Braille and designs intricate puzzle boxes for her to solve. Under his guidance, Marie-Laure learns to negotiate her way with her cane from their apartment to the museum and then home again. Despite her natural shyness, Marie-Laure develops a sharp, inquisitive intelligence and a steely resilience as World War II begins.

When Paris falls to the Nazis, Marie-Laure and her father flee to the town of Saint-Malo in Brittany where they take refuge with relatives. There her father constructs a detailed wooden model of the town. By touching each door, each tree, each streetlight in the model, Marie-Laure memorizes every street and landmark until she can confidently make her way around the coastal town. She counts the steps and manhole covers; she learns the sounds and smells unique to every street and place; she follows railings and cables and hedges.

The shy, blind little girl grows into a courageous and resourceful young woman. Marie-Laure's intelligence, resourcefulness and courage make her an unexpectedly effective operative for the French Resistance. She is able to see "the light" that the "seeing" world around her cannot perceive. She embraces the simple wisdom and faith of her aunt in Saint-Malo: "If God wants us to see something, we'll see it."

Epiphany celebrates the dawning of Christ, the light of God that shatters the darkness of sin and hopelessness, the light that illuminates our hearts to realize the love of God in our midst. But to "see" that love in our lives, as Marie-Laure learns, requires us to pay attention for the signs of that love:

On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

realities we do not readily perceive or understand or appreciate — or would rather ignore altogether. Too often we retreat into the safe isolation of convention or we find comfort in cold rationalizations rather than "seeing" the brokenness of our brothers and sisters or hearing the cries of the poor and needy in our midst. Like Marie-Laure's persistence in learning to "see" with the eye of her intellect and understanding, we have to look with more than just our senses but with our hearts and souls to "see" our world through God's prism of hope and possibility. Was it the gift itself, the thought that went into it, or the person who gave it to you?

It is a long-standing tradition in the Church that on the Feast of the Epiphany, we bless all the doors of our homes which lead outdoors. There is specially blessed chalk on the table near the Sanctuary that you are encouraged to take home and use to mark the doors leading in and out of your homes that you bless with the following blessing:

Let us begin by blessing ourselves: In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Let us pray:

When Jesus was born of the Blessed Virgin Mary, he made his home with us. We now ask that he will always be welcome to this home of ours, to bless it with his presence. We will now pray silently, for all the good we hope will bless our home this year (pause).

May Jesus always be here with us, to strengthen our love for each other. May Jesus share in our joys and comfort us in any of our sorrows.

Inspired by Jesus' teaching and example, may we always seek to make our home a dwelling place of his love, keeping away any evil and bringing the goodness of Jesus to all who come and go from our home.

Mark each door as follows: 20 + C + M + B + 24

This stands for: Anno Domini (Year of the Lord) two thousand twenty-four. Christus Mansionem Benedicat (May Christ Bless this House)

It's January again—time to make those New Year's Resolutions! During this Year of Faith why not make a few resolutions to become a better Catholic in 2024? You certainly don't have to tackle all ten, but choose two or three goals to improve your spiritual life this year.

1. Attend daily Mass

We offer daily mass during the week at 7:00 a.m. and 12:05 p.m. Since the group attending is usually small and there is often no singing, our daily masses will only take about 30 minutes of your day. In return, you'll receive extra graces and blessings for the small sacrifice.

2. Spend some time in front of the Blessed Sacrament

We offer Eucharistic Adoration on the First Saturday of the month at 8:30 a.m. and the first Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m., but you can stop by our church or any Catholic church any time the doors are open and spend a little quality time with Christ. Even just 10-15 minutes on a regular basis will deeply improve your spiritual life.

3. Go to Confession every month

Yes, it's difficult to face your sins and say them out loud, but frequent reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation gives you the grace to fight those sins and perhaps finally defeat them. Come to confession at Assumption every Saturday at 4:15—5:00 p.m., or call the parish office to make an appointment for a priest to hear your confession.

4. Pray the Rosary

The Rosary has been hailed by saints and popes alike as a powerful weapon to defeat evil and a beautiful way to meditate on the gospels. There are many powerful blessings and promises granted to those devoted to the Rosary. We pray the Rosary at Assumption weekdays at 11: 40 a.m.

5. Find a patron saint

If you don't have a patron saint, it's time to find one! Saints are our heroes in faith and are powerful intercessors for us in heaven. You might want to learn more about the saint you were named after, your Confirmation saint, the patron saint of your profession or hobby or any saint who interests you.

6. Read the Bible

If you don't own a Catholic Bible, invest in one and keep it out where you will see it every day. Attend one of our Bible studies, held Monday mornings and Saturday mornings. You'll also find helpful guides online or in a Catholic bookstore.

7. Learn about your faith

If all you do is go to mass every Sunday, you're missing out on many wonderful resources for your faith. This year, resolve to join FORMED, and read, participate in programs, and watch movies and videos about your Catholic faith. It's free! To join visit www.formed.org

8. Get involved at Assumption

Volunteering as a lector, Eucharistic Minister, choir member or usher requires a very small time commitment but will pay off by helping you to feel like an important part of Assumption parish. 9. Check out Catholic radio

Catholic radio stations are popping up all over America and you need not live near one to listen in. Most stations broadcast online or offer smartphone apps. Try a few different stations and programs to find one that interests you.

10. Carry a Catholic Smartphone

There are plenty of smartphone apps to help you become a better Catholic. Simply type "Catholic" in your phone's app store search index, and you'll find a long list of apps including prayers, Catholic radio stations, Confession guides, Bibles, etc. Instead of texting or checking email during idle time, make use of those apps to learn more about your faith.






