GATHER IN PRAYER

Pray the Rosary weekdays 20 minutes before the 12:05 p.m. Mass. On Thursdays, the Rosary before 12:05 Mass is offered for priests and for vocations to the priesthood.

First Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1,6-7,10-13

In our first reading, the prophet Samuel searches among God's people for the next person to be king. He learns that God's choices do not conform to superficial human expectations or prejudices. Is this a lesson we need to learn as well?

econd Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

This portion of an early Christian letter instructs believers that God desires behavior based on goodness and justice.

🖁 ospel: John 9:1-41

When the Gospel of John was written, sixty years after Jesus' ministry, Jewish members of John's church had recently been barred from synagogue membership. This situation is evident in the comments made about the parents of the blind man whom Jesus heals in this Gospel passage. Angry at those who caused the expulsion, the Gospel writer depicts the Pharisees as more blind than the formerly sightless man. The anger in this passage would prompt us to reflect on times when we have been blind, when we have failed to see God at work in unexpected people and places.

JESUS CURES THE MAN BORN BLIND

The healing of the man born blind: "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind."

(John 9: 1-41)

Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy. On a given morning in the parish hall, the teenagers in the Confirmation class are packing up winter coats they have collected for the homeless.


Later that day, the hall kitchen buzzes with volunteers preparing soup and sandwiches for the parish's regular turn that night at the downtown soup kitchen.

In the afternoon, a group of moms takes over the space and turns it into an after-school center for kids to come to do homework, enjoy a snack, receive tutoring help, and just have a safe place to hang out after school instead of going home to an empty house.

After supper, the knitting group will meet to make prayer shawls for the sick and dying in the parish. Their work is a warm, comforting assurance to the suffering and hurting in the parish that they are embraced in the prayers of the community.

It seems the lights never go out in this parish hall.

The many works and ministries that take place in the always busy parish hall are the real lights, reflecting the compassion of God dwelling in the church community. As Jesus heals the blind man "so that the works of God might be made visible through him," he opens our eyes to see and our hearts to make God's works of justice and reconciliation "visible" in our own time and place. In baptism, we are entrusted with those "works." Our least remarkable offerings of charity are extensions of the Eucharist we offer together at the Lord's table; our unheralded, unseen efforts to bring healing and hope to others illuminate the unseen presence of God in our midst. May our own water and clay - the time and talent we give in imitation of Christ's healing compassion - make



the love and grace of God visible in our homes and communities, our workplaces and classrooms, our parishes and gatherings. (Connections)

I WAS BLIND AND NOW I SEE

Some of us suffer from spiritual blindness. We waste time judging and criticizing others because they do not see things the way we do. We even blame people for their sufferings and believe that God is punishing them.

Adults: Do I consider illness and suffering punishment for past sins?

Children: Do I criticize my friends or family and say nasty things behind their backs?

Family Perspective: When infants are baptized, parents, with the help of the godparents, assume responsibility for raising the child as a follower of Jesus. The process of maturation in the faith is much like the example found in the story of the man born blind. The man is cured of his blindness, a symbol of his sin. Each time he meets someone after the healing, the man comes to a deeper awareness of who Jesus is. In a similar way, we who are baptized continue to mature in faith as our relationship with and knowledge about Jesus grows. Invite each member of your family to draw a timeline of his or her life. On the timelines, ask family members to identify significant moments in their lives, especially their life of faith. Invite each person to reflect upon who Jesus was to him or her at each significant moment. How has each person's relationship with Jesus changed or matured?

OCIA RITE OF ELECTION

On March 9, 174 catechumens became the elect, moving a step closer to being welcomed as full members of the Catholic Church at this year's Rite of Election ceremony at St. John the Baptist Cathedral in Paterson on the First Sunday of Lent. These adults, teens, and children will receive the Sacraments of Initiation — baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist — at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, April 19. Bishop Kevin J. Sweeney formally selected — or elected —them at the Rite of Election that he presided over in English and Spanish. The ceremony formally sets the newly elected toward full sacramental unity with the Church.


BABY BOTTLE BLESSINGS!
