irst Reading: Acts 10:34.37-43



econd Reading: 1 Corinthians 5:6-8

In this excerpt from his letter to the Church in Corinth, the Apostle Paul declares that followers of Christ must put aside their former, sinful ways and put on the new life of the Raised One.

ospel: John 20:1-9

Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. Our Gospel today tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection. The details invite us to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection.

#### **HE IS RISEN!**

"Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." John 20: 8-9

Jesus is Risen! Alleluia! These are the words proclaimed at Easter. These are the words at the heart of the Gospel. As Christians, these are the words we express to each other when we say "Happy Easter." Our word, Easter, is derived from the Old English, *eastre*, for east, the direction in which we see the sun rise each day. Our celebration of the Rising of the Son is the oldest and most important day of our year. This celebration is also called *Pascha*, from the Greek word for "Passover." This is our time of liberation from the bonds of the slavery of sin and death.

On Easter we proclaim our faith in eternal life and the new life of salvation given to us through Christ. At the Easter Vigil we celebrated the Sacraments of Initiation into this new life of faith. Jacob Bryan, Giovanni DeBelli, Tina Minano, Sean Susini, and Adam Weatherly were Baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and received the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. Brielle Cook, Nick Morosco and Abbie Pisciotto were received into the Catholic Church, and received the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. Fabiano Alu, Robert Duffin, and Daniel Jiminzez received the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation, and Daniel Long, Evan Pedraza and Tyler Small received the sacrament of Confirmation.

We celebrate Our Savior's Resurrection and our new life for fifty days. The Easter season begins on Easter Sunday and continues through Pentecost. The first eight days after Easter Sunday are the Octave of Easter and they are one solemn Easter. The Paschal Candle, blessed at the Easter Vigil, is lit for every Mass during the whole Easter season and the Easter Water, blessed at the Vigil is used throughout this season as well. For the newly baptized (neophytes), the Easter season is a time for continued education and reflection called *mystagogia*. They continue to participate in the O.C.I.A.,( the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults). We continue to rejoice through this Easter Season of fifty-days because we believe in eternal life in Jesus Christ.

Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; and he saw the linen cloths lying there, and the handkerchief that had been around His head, not lying with the linen cloths, but folded together in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who came to the tomb first, went in also; and he saw and believed. For as yet they did not know the Scripture, that He must rise again from the dead.

#### LIVING A NEW LIFE

The four Gospels all recount the fact that an empty tomb was discovered by a few disciples. But an empty tomb would not be enough proof that Jesus had indeed risen. All of his followers would fully come to faith through the post-Resurrection appearances of Christ.

Adults: How has my faith about the Risen Christ been nourished?

*Children:* If I were with Peter and the beloved disciple, what might I have thought?

A Family Perspective: Gather your family members and ask them to share what they know about the events that happened in the days after Jesus' crucifixion. Invite your family to imagine that they are among Jesus' first disciples. Read together today's Gospel, John 20:1-9. Reflect together on the Gospel with questions such as these: If you had been among the first disciples who heard that the stone had been removed from Jesus' tomb and that Jesus' body was no longer there, what would you think? What did Mary of Magdala, Simon Peter, and the disciple whom Jesus loved think had happened? Recall that this experience is the first indication Jesus' disciples have that he is risen. Throughout the Easter season, we will learn more about how the disciples came to learn that Jesus had been raised from the dead.
