irst Reading: Acts 5:27-32,40b-41


This weekend's first reading is a portion of the Acts of the Apostles. Although the preaching of the first apostles is warmly received by the people of Jerusalem, the high priest is displeased and arrests them. But after the intervention of a Pharisee named Gamaliel the apostles are released and resume their preaching.

C econd Reading: Revelation 5:11-14

In our second reading, John of Patmos continues his message of comfort to a terribly persecuted church. He describes a symbolic vision of great majesty as the heavenly court glorifies both God and the raised Jesus.

<u> ospel: John 21:1-19</u>

Our Gospel passage is from a second ending added to the Gospel of John shortly after the completion of the original version. Although the mysterious "beloved disciple" recognizes the raised Jesus even before Peter, a moving reconciliation between Jesus and Peter takes place. Whereas Peter had denied Jesus three times, he now declares his love for him three times, and is commissioned to shepherd Jesus' flock in close imitation of Jesus.

THE RISEN LORD AND SAINT PETER ON THE BEACH

[Jesus] said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. [...] Jesus said to Simon the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?"

"Lord, you know everything; you know I love you." (John 21: 1-19)

Today's Gospel is one of my favorites. John 21 recounts how the Risen Lord appeared at the seashore and challenges the disciples to listen to his instructions and commissions them to preach to the whole world. The miraculous number of fish signifies the universality of their mission; they must tell all people the Lord is Risen. The Gospel also contains Jesus' encounter with Peter and his forgiveness after Peter professes his love for the Lord three times, reversing his three-fold denial in the Passion. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

Maybe it was the day you and the love of your life promised that each of you would be there for the other forever — and that promise still holds.

Maybe it was the wisdom of a teacher or mentor who helped you through that treacherous path between childhood and adulthood, setting you on your life's course.

Maybe it was the friend who stayed up with you all night, whose refusal to abandon you literally saved your life.

You didn't ask. You didn't wonder. You just knew.

God was there.

The love of God's Christ was in your midst. You dared not say it. The idea might have been too pietistic or spiritual for the "pagan" in you. But inside you knew — and you felt good about it. God made his loving presence known in your life; you experienced God's promise of resurrection.

In today's Gospel, the Risen Jesus makes his presence known to Peter and his fishing companions by calling them to cast their nets off the "right" side of the boat. Despite their doubts and frustrations, they do as Jesus instructs and end up with a remarkable catch. When



we act out of love, when we put aside our own fears and expectations for the sake of another, when we seek to imitate the selfless compassion of the Risen One, we reveal the presence of God in our ordinary, unremarkable but blessed and grace-filled lives. (Connections)

RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD

If we are to follow the example of Peter in today's Gospel, we will live the connection between love and sorrow. Sometimes the path of love consists in recognizing the ways in which we have hurt others.

Adults: Is there someone in my family whom I have offended and to whom I should offer an apology?

Children: Do I understand that when I have made a mistake, Jesus asks me to say I'm sorry?

Use one of these suggestions or one of your own to respond to God's word this week.

In the home: Remember a quarrel or offense that happened in your family, and make a specific intention to express your love to the people involved.

In the workplace or in school: Identify someone who was brave enough to say they were sorry. Affirm them for doing so.

In the community: Determine whether there is any personal strain among the people in the groups to which you belong, and consider whether admitting your responsibility in the strain might improve the situation.

ABOUT THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Pope Paul VI designated the fourth Sunday of Easter, or Good Shepherd Sunday, as World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It reminds us to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38; Luke 10:2). We are reminded in a particular way to pray that men and women who are discerning their own life vocation will listen to the grace of God to guide them, and if called, will respond generously to the Lord's invitation to the priesthood, diaconate, or religious life.

We are all also reminded that each and every one of us are all called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity in ourselves. We are to use our strength accordingly as we have received it, as a gift from Christ; we are to seek the will of the Father in all things; and we are to devote ourselves with all of our being to the glory of God and to the service of our neighbor. Whether as a priest, nun, brother, or deacon; husband, wife, or single person, we pray for fidelity to our own vocation, and to our loving God who blesses us with His unconditional and infinite love.




