irst Reading: Acts 13:14,43-52


In this first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Luke portrays a mixed reception to the preaching of Paul and Barnabas. Although "many Jews" are convinced by their words, other Jews oppose them and force them to move on. Thus the words of Simeon from early in Luke's Gospel come to fruition: Jesus is the occasion for the fall and rising of many in Israel.

C econd Reading: Revelation 7:9,14-17

In our second reading, John of Patmos continues his message of comfort to a terribly persecuted church. He describes the glorious destiny awaiting those whose faith remains strong even though they are subject to torture and death by the orders of the Roman Emperor.

ospel: John 10:27-30

One of the themes of the Gospel of John is that believers must have a personal, intimate relationship with Jesus. This is conveyed by the images of a shepherd and his sheep in this passage.

MOTHER'S DAY AND GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me . . . "
John 10: 27-30

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is often called "Good Shepherd Sunday" because we read John 10 and learn how Jesus is the Good Shepherd. This year we also celebrate Mother's Day. We honor all our Moms! Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy. Practicing in one of Baltimore's poorest neighborhoods is one of the city's "richest" physicians.

Dr. Michael Zollicoffer is a second-generation pediatrician. For more than 40 years, "Dr. Z," as he is known to his patients, has run his practice with one rule: "Never deny people medical care because of cost." Dr. Z will see anyone no matter what.


And the 66-year-old physician is just as generous with his time. He gives his cell number to patients, telling them that they can call him 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. In his 40 years practicing medicine, he has never taken a real vacation. He hasn't made much money in medicine, but he is rich in job satisfaction.

Then, last fall, Dr. Z was diagnosed with colorectal and renal cancer. To add insult to injury, Dr. Z discovered he didn't have insurance because of a paperwork issue with his Medicare plan. He could not pay for his radiation treatments.

That's when the patients he cared for so joyfully became his caregivers. "Dr. Z will not give up on you, so we damn sure ain't giving up on him," one patient said. So his patients — one thousand of them — raised nearly \$100,000. Gifts ranged from \$5 to \$5000 — every gift, no matter the amount, meant the same to Dr. Z.

Dr. Z's prognosis is good — and the insurance issue has been corrected. He still goes to his office every day to see patients. He plans to funnel the remaining money into the community.

"I'm going to say something that may seem crazy as heck," Dr. Z said. "I'm thankful that I got cancer, because I am the happiest man on the planet, no matter what the outcome. What we have shown . . . America: This is what we're about! We are about giving! I can't make it without them, nor can they make it without me." Both Dr. Z and his patients model the role of "shepherding" that Jesus calls each one of us to take on. Sometimes we are the shepherd able to reach out to heal, to lift up, to rescue — and sometimes we are the one in need of help and rescue. Whether "shepherd" or "sheep," may we respond to the voice of

Christ the Good Shepherd calling us to his spirit of selfless giving and humble generosity. (Connections)

SEEKING OUT THE LOST

Jesus promised that as long as we hear his voice and follow it, no one will take us away from the Father's love. And we know that the words and deeds of Jesus are the words and deeds of God.

Adults: Do I get distracted by the voices of false shepherds? What helps me focus more on the voice of the Good Shepherd?

Children: How do I know that Jesus, the Good Shepherd, is protecting and guiding me? When do I feel his love and care the most?

A Family Perspective: Not only can we recognize family members' voices, we can also read the tone of their voices and know something about how they are feeling. In our relationship with Jesus, we know Jesus' voice and are called to follow. Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies so closely with the Father that he tells us that they are one—not just close, but actually one. Knowing Jesus means knowing the Father. Read with your family today's Gospel, John 10:27-30. Ask your family members to talk about some ways that Jesus brings them closer to God and closer to one another.


