- Eucharistic Adoration the first Saturday of each month 8:30 - 9:00 a.m. and the first Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m.


rst Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

Our reading from the Hebrew Scriptures is a beautiful passage about Lady Wisdom. A feminine persona of God, she informs much of the New Testament's ideas about the Holy Spirit. Among other things, she is the guiding presence of God in the book of the Torah, in the Temple of Jerusalem, and in the people of Israel. In this portion of the book of Proverbs, Lady Wisdom is God's playful partner in the creation of the world.

<u>econd Reading: Romans 5:1-5</u>

In this section of his letter to the Church in Rome, the Apostle Paul points to the presence of the Holy Spirit as a sign of the saving power of Jesus at work.

This Gospel reading comes from the last Supper discourse in the Gospel of John. After having told the disciples that he must die in order for the Holy Spirit to come, Jesus explains that this spirit will continue to reveal the things of God to them.

THE HOLY TRINITY

"... the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth." (John 16: 12-15)

Trinity Sunday invites us to rediscover the many ways in which the love of God is revealed in our lives through every wonderful work of creation formed by the hand of God. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

He's the first one in his family to go to college. His mom and dad have sacrificed mightily to make this dream possible for him. He's worked hard, too, taking on two part-time jobs to help cover the expenses his scholarships and grants don't cover. But Tuesday afternoons are sacred — that's when he spends the afternoon at a city high school mentoring students just like him: students of color who have the potential to be the first in their families to go to college. His generosity is the fingerprint of God.

Every day they rise before dawn and gather in the small room they have made their chapel. They are a community of five religious sisters: two sisters are from the United States who have spent more than 40 years working in Ghana; the three others are native Ghanian sisters. After Morning Prayer and a simple breakfast, the sisters go to work in their clinic, the community garden they tend with some of the women of the village, and the small pre-school they run for the children of the village. The villagers — many of whom are not Christian — love the sisters not only for their work but for the simplicity and generosity of their life among them — simplicity and charity that are the fingerprints of God.

They have three children of their own and, like all families, making the household budget work each month is a challenge. But they don't hesitate for a moment to make a place in their home — and hearts — for a child in need of a safe and welcoming place for a few weeks or months — or longer. Over the past 10 years, they have been foster parents to five children. Their own children have happily been big brothers and sisters to these children whose young lives have been a nightmare. Yes, it's demanding and often heartbreaking, but they believe that every child deserves to be loved and cared for. Such compassion is the fingerprint of God.

In his book Abide in Love, Latin American priest and poet Ernesto Cardenal writes of "the fingerprint of God" that is found on every molecule of creation, on every moment of inspiration, on every work of peace. Faith begins with realizing the Spirit of God breathing life into all that exists; faith that compels us to continue the creative work of God, faith that invites us to embrace and be embraced in God's love that envelopes every wonder of nature and every manifestation of compassion. Today's Feast of the Holy Trinity invites us to realize the many ways and the many people in which the love of God is revealed in our lives. May our own hearts be opened to the Spirit of God revealing the "fingerprint" of God's love in whatever ways we are capable of offering, however small and ordinary and unassuming. (Connections)

As we celebrate the mystery of the Trinity we are grateful because God reveals Himself to us as He is. He comes to us and reaches out to save us. He is not a "lonesome" God; he is Three-in-One. He needs nothing to make him happy, yet he has created the universe for us. Sinless he has sent his Son to save us while we were

> yet sinners. He is loving and good and HE sends his Holy Spirit to sanctify us.

Biblical stories recall how much God desires to be with the people and how many times God forgives them and calls them back to relationship with him.

Adults: How does the belief in a relational God affect the way I treat others?

Children: I know God loves me. How can I show my friends that God also loves them very much?

A Family Perspective: Think of the last time you witnessed an act of selfless love in your family. Parents and caregivers of all kinds are called upon to act selflessly every day. Family life calls us to share selfless love with one another. God is the model for us of selfless love. There was no need for God to create our planet or the creatures that inhabit it; it was an act of selfless love. There was also no need for God to send his only Son to save us. That too was an act of selfless love. As we draw closer to God and the mystery of the Trinity, we learn about God's love. God has lavished us with love in the persons of the Son and the Spirit, who in turn nurture in us the desire to do the same. When we open ourselves to be filled with an awareness of the divine life within us, we participate in the endless spiral of love that leads to eternal life. Whenever we share selfless love in the family, we are sharing in the life of the Trinity.
