

NOTHING WILL HARM YOU

"Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household...'
"Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you." (Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20)

In today's Gospel Jesus sends out the 72 disciples to prepare for his arrival and he empowers them for their mission. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

They are doctors, nurses, lab technicians, therapists, and medical and nursing students. They put in full days — and nights — at Boston hospitals. But come Tuesday night, they head to a downtown church to engage in another work of healing: music.

They are the Longwood Chorus, a 70-voice choir made up of health care professionals working in Boston's world-class hospitals in the Longwood section of the city. The Longwood Chorus is one of the few vocal ensembles of its kind in the world, composed entirely of medical and science-related professionals.


The chorus was founded in 2017 by two Harvard Medical School students. The original mission was to reduce burn-out and promote wellness among those in high-stress medical professions — but the chorus' critically acclaimed performances bring some of the world's greatest musical works to New England audiences.

Jeremy Faust is an attending emergency physician at Bringham and Women's Hospital and an assistant professor at Harvard Medical School. He's also an accomplished musician, composer and conductor. Faust serves as Longwood's music director. "Choral music in general is such a beautiful art form to be a part of, and it is such a special part of many peoples' lives for those who do it. But to be able to combine that with people who you also share professional interests with is just a really remarkable and amazing opportunity."

The chorus performs two major concerts a year: at the end of fall and spring semesters. Recent performances have included Benjamin Britton's **A Ceremony of Carols** and the song cycle **Lux Aeterna** by Morton Lauridsen. Throughout the year, singers also participate in smaller, community-centered events, such as seasonal caroling around Boston or small concerts in hospital lobbies.

Members of the Longwood Chorus see their music as not just a respite from their hectic careers but as an extension of their professions. Iris Chan, an assistant music director and a medical student at Tufts University, explains: "Music is not just about me making music. It is about how it affects other people's moods. And there's so much to music that can affect people's happiness. I think that is something we can bring, as a choir, to other people too."

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends forth the seventy-two to go ahead of him and make ready for his coming. They are to be Jesus' agents for healing and reconciliation by their humble generosity and compassion. And Jesus promises that they will make a difference in people's lives — and their work will



make a difference in their own lives, as well. In the music they perform, the dedicated medical professionals of the Longwood Chorus reveal the reconciling peace of God in the midst — both for their audiences and for each other. We, too, can be the means for revealing God's peace in our midst by the

simple "music" of the offerings of our own skills and talents to those we travel with on the road to God's dwelling place.

LAMBS AMONG WOLVES

We are called and sent out into the world to bring the Good News of the Kingdom of God – the kingdom of peace, justice, and love which Christ instituted with his coming.

Adults: Does the peace of Christ reign in my home and place of work? Is there anything that I can do to bring it about?

A Family Perspective: Families teach a sense of togetherness and community. Talk about all the ways that your family works together. Talk about the various chores and tasks that family members work on together to accomplish in order to keep the household running smoothly. Discuss ways that your family can work more closely together to support one another and to make the household run more smoothly. Pray for the strength to overcome the temptation to be too individualistic and to recognize the need for working together as a family.

Who is it for?

Faith Formation is for all children of the parish who do not attend Assumption School or another Catholic School.

What age does it start?

Children as young as age 3 are invited to join us for the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd*, a Montessori approach to Faith Formation.

What age should I register my child for First Reconciliation and First Communion?

The Diocese of Paterson dictates that children must have two years of Faith Formation, typically first and second grade, in preparation for receiving First Reconciliation and First Communion in second grade.

What if my child is older than 2nd grade and has not had any formal Faith Formation?

When should I register my teen for Confirmation Prep?

Again, the Diocese of Paterson asks that teens have two years of Faith Formation, typically freshman and sophomore year of high school, in preparation for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in sophomore year. This is for all teens of the parish regardless of where they attend high school.

When does Faith Formation end?

Faith Formation is ongoing. Children continue to attend sessions in the years following First Communion and prior to Confirmation. After Confirmation, teens are encouraged to participate in the life of the parish through the Youth Mass and Youth Ministry activities.
