First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

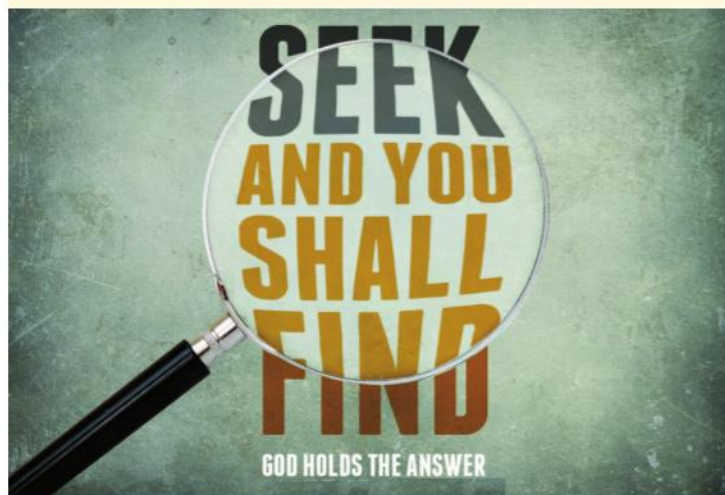
This Hebrew Scripture reading is a wonderful example of the intimacy that is possible for those in covenant with God. Abraham negotiates with God about an issue of justice and their conversation flows back and forth between them. Abraham's confidence in the strength of his relationship with God is a model for all God's people.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Our second reading continues to present the reflections of the writer of the Letter to the Colossians. He stresses how Gentile Christians have died to their pagan way of life by their baptisms into the death of Christ. They have been raised to new life through the resurrection.

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

In this selection from the Gospel of Luke, the evangelist has collected together a number of different sayings of Jesus about prayer. Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer stresses that the coming of the Kingdom involves forgiveness. The other sayings encourage prayer to the One who shares the spirit with us.

PERSIST IN PRAYER

*“... ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.
For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks,
the door will be opened...”*

*“If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more with the
Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?” (Luke 11: 1-13)*

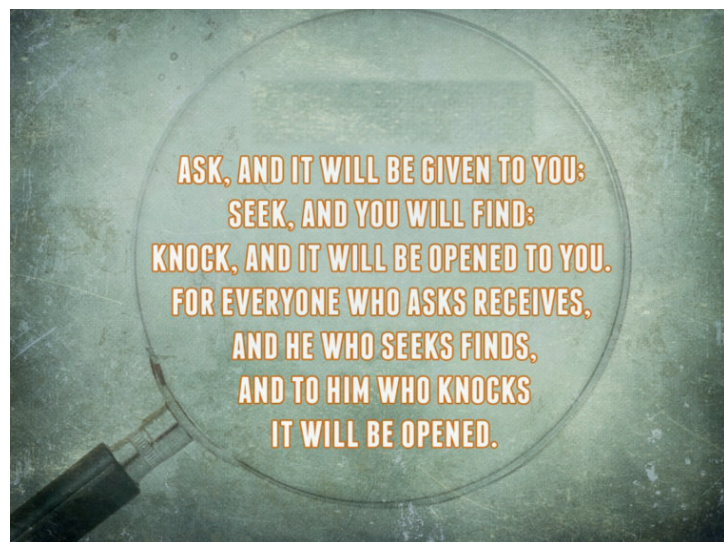
Jesus teaches us how to pray. He gives us “The Lord’s Prayer” and tells us that God knows all our needs and wants to provide for us. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

A woman asks: “Please, God, cure me of my cancer.” In dealing with her illness, she has accepted her mortality. She comes to cherish each moment she has. Her relationship with her husband becomes stronger; she grows closer to her children, especially to one daughter who had become increasingly distant. The disease runs its course — but she learns to live her life to the full and she spends every moment to the end in the embrace of her loving family. And it is that love that she will leave behind. She **asks** — and she receives insight, understanding and peace.

A teenager seeks the answer to the question we all ask: *What am I supposed to do with my life?* As he makes that difficult transition from child to teenager, he comes to realize that he’s not the center of the world; he learns how to be responsible and how to care about people other than himself and about things bigger than his own wants. He volunteers to work at a summer camp for kids at risk — it proves to be a life-changing experience for him. He decides to major in social work in college. Not much money, but it’s work that makes a difference. He **seeks** — and finds fulfillment in helping families keep it together.

She nervously knocks on the door. When that door opens, her life will change: A new career, perhaps. The beginning of a life of prayer and service in a religious community, maybe. The responsibility to care for a desperately ill parent. Meeting her future in-laws for the first time. But she’s ready. She’s confident in her commitment and her skills and abilities; she trusts in the love that has embraced her and that enables her to embrace others. She **knocks** — and whatever is on the other side of the door, she is confident God’s grace will enable her to walk through.

Those who ask *will* receive, Jesus says; those who seek *will* find; those who knock *will* find their way through — but to those of us who have offered countless prayers that we feel have gone unanswered, Jesus’ promise seems disingenuous. But often our prayer results in something we do not expect; what we receive is quite different from what we ask for. We often approach prayer as trying to wring gifts from an unwilling God; in fact, we come before a God who knows our needs better than we do ourselves. That’s the disciple’s faith: to trust enough to continue to act in the spirit of Jesus’ servanthood, to continue to seek God in hidden places with the assurance that, in someone or something, we will find him. PERSISTENCE

Today's Gospel encourages us to approach God with confidence, to address God affectionately as "Father," and to be persistent with prayer until those prayers are answered.

Adults: What are my deepest needs? What keeps me from bringing these needs to God and asking God for help in meeting these needs?

Children: What can I do each day to improve the frequency and the quality of my prayer?

A Family Perspective: When someone in our family is going through a hard time, we can't just sit by and watch. We try to do everything we can to let him or her know that he or she is not alone. Like a good father, God saw that his children needed help. He decided to offer his beloved children a special gift to reveal his love. What did God give us? Not a thing, but a person—the Father's beloved Son, Jesus. Jesus, in turn, taught us to approach God as we would approach a loving father. He gave us the words of a prayer that we call the "Our Father." Talk about how Jesus teaches us to be persistent in prayer. Think of times when family members were persistent about something until they were able to achieve a goal or receive what they sought. Help your children understand that prayer is not like sitting on Santa Claus' lap, asking for what we want until we get it. Emphasize that prayer is a way of striving to recognize how God is reaching out to us in love and responding by presenting him with our needs.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

Are you, or someone you know, a person who wonders why Catholics do the things they do? Do you know a non-Catholic who is perhaps pondering the faith and considering joining the Church? Is the Holy Spirit leading anyone you know to pursue full initiation? Were you baptized Catholic as a child, but have not made the Sacraments of Communion and/or Confirmation? OCIA could be the answer.

Now that this phase of the project is complete, the next phase of replacing the windows begins. Once that is finished, the building will be painted.
