irst Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17


In our first reading, the prophet Elisha refuses to accept a gift from a pagan warlord who has just been cured of leprosy. Acceptance would imply that Elisha was responsible for the healing. Instead, the prophet wants gratitude directed where it belongs—to God.

econd Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

In this excerpt from a letter written in Paul's name, the author stresses the centrality of the resurrection for Christian faith. Because Christ was raised, Christians will also be raised.

ospel: Luke 17:11-19

The first reading's stress on being grateful to God is also emphasized in the Gospel. A second point is made as well: sometimes those outside our faith community are quicker to acknowledge God's goodness than we are.

GRATITUDE AND HUMILITY

As [Jesus] was entering a village, ten lepers met him and raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us . . . !"

One of the lepers, realizing that he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. (Luke 17: 11-19)

Here is a story I hope you will enjoy.

There was a saint who lived a life of humble charity and gratitude. He had no idea of his own sanctity — he was aware only of the needs of others and the presence of God in all.

God decided one day that this saint should receive a special blessing for his faithfulness and so dispatched an angel to visit the saint. The angel appeared before him, bending low and said, "I have been sent to you by God. Ask for anything and it will be given to you."

The saint hesitated, wondering what in the world he could ask for. The angel then asked, "Would you want the gift of healing?" "No," the saint replied. "I'd rather that God did the healing and be praised for it."

"Would you like others to imitate your holiness and thus bless God and come closer to God?" "That would be terrible," the saint replied. "That would make me the center of attention rather than God."

"Might God make you a great preacher and reconciler, bringing sinners and lost souls back to the fold?" the angel offered. "Please, no. I've always believed that was the work of Jesus the Shepherd and that you angels rejoiced over each one who came home."

Struggling to hide his exasperation, the angel asked, "So how might God bless you? What would you want? Please ask for something. This blessing is God's will."

The saint thought quietly for some time. "All right," he finally said. "If I must have some blessing, then give me this: that all the good I do, I will do without realizing it, and no one will know that it was my doing. And so they will bless God for God's goodness."

The angel agreed to such a blessing. All the kindnesses and generosity the saint would do would be a blessing to others, but it would always be behind him. He would never know and others would never suspect and they would bless God for his goodness. And so it has been. [Adapted from a story by Anthony DeMello.]

Our world could certainly use more saints like this — but do we dare embrace such an attitude ourselves? In these "transactional" times, operating out of such a perspective of humility and gratitude can put us at the mercy of the users and abusers who take what they want regardless of the cost and hardship to others. But selfless gratitude is at the heart of the faith we profess. Gratitude is a practice — a way of approaching life — that is grounded in the conviction that God has breathed his life into us for no other reason than love so deep we cannot begin to fathom it, and that the only fitting response we can make to such inexplicable and unmerited love is to stand humbly before God

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God not by works, so that no one can boast. quiet, humble gratitude. It's that perspective of thankfulness exhibited by the Samaritan leper that is at the heart of the human spirit, that reveals to us the meaning and purpose of these lives God has breathed into us, that makes whatever good we do experiences of grace. THANKFULNESS IN LATER LIFE

In today's Gospel only one of the ten lepers returns to give thanks. The lack of response by the others is a warning to us. Even though gratitude is essential for a joyful and complete life, it is often neglected.

Adults: What do I count as my greatest blessing? How often do I thank God for giving it to me?

Children: How can I thank God for what I have received?

A Family Perspective: Children fluctuate between moments of deep, heartfelt gratitude and an attitude of entitlement. These fluctuations are normal. Among our tasks as parents is to help foster the gift of gratitude, particularly gratitude to God for all God's goodness to us. Read today's Gospel, Luke 17:11-19. Make a poster showing some of the gifts from God to your family. Display this poster in a prominent place and, as a family, write a prayer of thanksgiving for all of God's goodness to you.

In the home: Discuss what young people and what older people in your family do best. Give thanks to God for both.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

What is OCIA?

- 2. Those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
- 3. Baptized Catholics who were never formed in the Catholic faith and have not completed their initiation; that is, who have received neither of the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.


