THE PHARISEE AND THE TAX COLLECTOR IN THE TEMPLE

"The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity — greedy, dishonest, adulterous — or even like this tax collector . . . 'But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.'"(Luke 18: 9-14)

Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

A newborn child is the center of the world — at least that's the way it seems.

The presence of the newborn monopolizes the life of the entire family. The child's every need and want are provided for. So helpless, so fragile, the infant is doted upon, fussed over and fretted about by his anxious parents. Every aspect of the family's life revolves around the child's needs. A baby's parents respond immediately to their child's tears; to them, the sound of their baby's laughter is the most beautiful sound in the world.

But as a child develops and grows and is able to do more and more for himself or herself, the child begins to understand that he or she is not the center of the world, that the world is indeed much bigger than the child's needs and wants. The child is expected to take responsibility for his or her own actions and learns to live with the consequences of those decisions.

As the child enters adulthood, the young adult begins to take on responsibility for the needs and wants of others. The older the child becomes, the more mature the child develops, the more removed the child is from "being the center" of things, the clearer it becomes to the young adult that the needs and dreams of others are just as important as his or hers.

The transformation is complete when the now "adult" child becomes the parent of a newborn baby — and a new child becomes the center of the world.

Thomas Merton wrote that "humility is absolutely necessary if one is to avoid acting like a baby all one's fe. To grow up, in fact, means to become humble, to throw away the illusion that I am the center of verything and that other people exist to provide me with comfort and pleasure." The Gospel of Jesus



challenges us to embrace the humble, Godcentered faith of the tax collector and not the "childish," empty claims of the Pharisee. We manifest our love for God not through selfcongratulatory rituals of piety but through heartfelt and sincere love and care for the poor, the needy, the defenseless, the alienated and the rejected, seeing in them the face of Christ. KNOWING MY LIFE

The Word of God summons us to an extraordinary level of self-knowledge. It is the self-knowledge that can only come to us as we stand before God in complete, honest reflection and discard, as best as we can, all self-serving distortions.

Adults: Who or what best helps me to look clearly and honestly at myself?

Children: When I listen to God's holy Word, how do I find out who I am?

A Family Perspective: In the family, one sometimes observes a level of competition between children for parent attention, for acknowledgement of their abilities. Somehow, children seem to internalize that the attention given to one member of the family diminishes the attention given to another. In this way, children can often sound like the Pharisee in Jesus' parable. As a family, talk about what it means to compare oneself to another. Discuss whether it is helpful to compare oneself to another. In what ways might this be positive? In what circumstances might this be unhelpful? Discuss: What was wrong about the prayer of the Pharisee? How can we emulate the prayer of the tax collector? Pray together as a family in thanksgiving for the blessing that is each member of your family. Pray that your family will be free from unhealthy competition.

THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be administered to those needing to be anointed after the 12:00 p.m. Mass on Sunday, November 7.

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The Catholic belief of redemptive suffering, that is, uniting your own suffering with the crucified Jesus, gives a person's unavoidable suffering meaning and purpose. This notion is explicitly and implicitly expressed in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

It is our custom here at Assumption to place a blank book on a podium next to the Baptistry for All Soul's Day, November 2. This book, for centuries, was called the Book of the Dead as a somewhat stark reminder that according to our faith, we must experience what seems like death, as part of the process of entering into eternal union with our God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We lovingly inscribe the names of all who are dear to our hearts, who have gone before us into this joyful reunion with God.

60TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE SECOND VATICAN COUNCIL LECTURE


