First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13

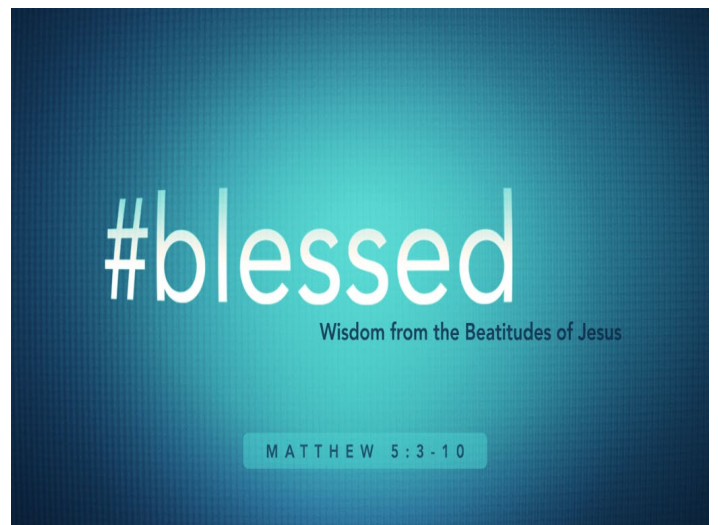
All of today's readings, in various ways, make the point that the God of Israel is on the side of the weak and humble. In the Hebrew Bible reading, the prophet Zephaniah speaks to those soon to be conquered by the Babylonians. He stresses that if they humbly pursue justice, God will not abandon them.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

In this segment of his letter to Corinth, the Apostle Paul reminds his readers, and us, that believers have done nothing to merit God's grace. We must humbly remember that we have no reason to boast.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

Today's reading from Matthew's Gospel presents an excerpt of the Sermon on the Mount. Like Moses on Mount Sinai, Jesus instructs how the people of God should behave. Those who humbly pursue justice will be vindicated by God.

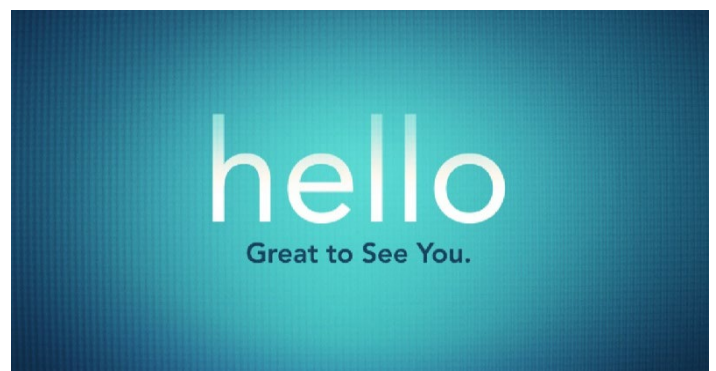

THE BEATITUDES

“Blessed are the poor in spirit . . . they who mourn . . . the meek . . . they who hunger and thirst for righteousness . . . the merciful . . . the clean of heart . . . the peacemakers . . . ”
(Matthew 5: 1-12a)

As this new year 2026 begins we are in the first chapters of Matthew’s Gospel and Jesus begins his Sermon on the Mount with the Beatitudes. Here is a reflection I hope you will enjoy.

Farmers and gardeners will all tell you: Humus is the gold in their fields and gardens. Composed of the decay of plant and animal matter, humus is the most organic and richest part of the soil. When it is tilled and broken open to receive seed and rainfall and sunlight, the dark humus soil yields the most bountiful harvests and the most beautiful of flowers.

The word *humility* comes from the same root as humus. Like the rich, broken soil of humus, humility is the capacity to be open to receive the seeds of experience — both the painful and the enriching — in order to grow in wisdom and understanding. Humility is the grace to let ourselves be “broken” — broken of our pride, our ego — in order to realize a harvest far greater than ourselves, a harvest that is possible only through generous openness, selfless giving and enlightened gratitude.

Humility is the grace to plant in hope, to persevere through droughts and storms and reap in joy.

Jesus calls all who would be his disciples to embrace the “blessedness” of the Sermon on the Mount: to possess the humility to “detach” from material things so as to “attach” ourselves to the things of God; to be honest enough with ourselves to realize our need to be forgiven and reconciled with God and family and friends; to embrace the spirit of “mercy” that enables us to consider things from the perspective of others and feel their joys and sorrows; to be makers of “peace” that honors and upholds humanity’s highest good.

BLESSED ARE YOU

The Beatitudes are a radical invitation to all Christians to revisit our priorities. Jesus is asking us to value everything that society rejects: poverty, suffering, hunger, etc. and blesses us if we are poor in spirit or persecuted for his sake.

Adults: Which Beatitude do I identify with in my own life? How or why?

Children: Am I a peacemaker as Jesus asks me to be or do I ever bully others?

Today's Gospel offers a contrast to many of the messages we hear in our society today. If we were to accept uncritically the "get ahead" messages of our culture, we would think that happiness means having money, being successful, having many possessions, and so on. When we think this way, we are not unlike the people who heard Jesus teach on the day that he taught the Beatitudes. The crowd that day also associated happiness with material possessions and status.

Talk as a family about what it means to be happy or to be blessed. Make a list of traits that you would associate with a happy person. Then read together today's Gospel, Matthew 5:1-12a. Reflect on Jesus' description of happiness. Think about what each of the Beatitudes might have in common and write a family summary of the Beatitudes. Post the summary in a special place as a reminder of what your family will consider "true happiness."

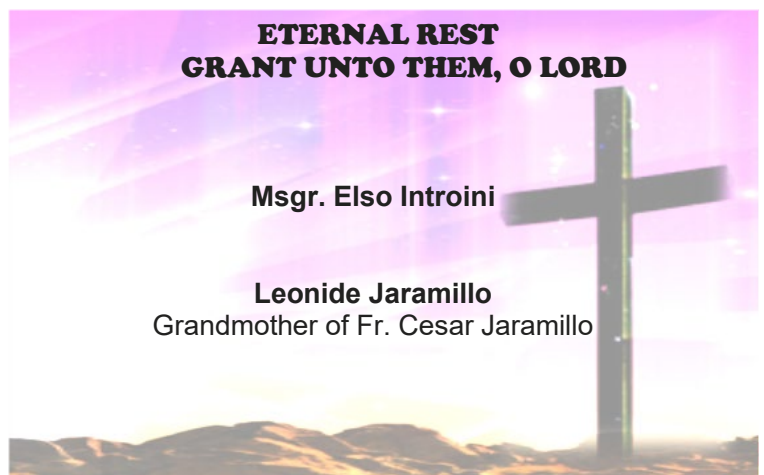



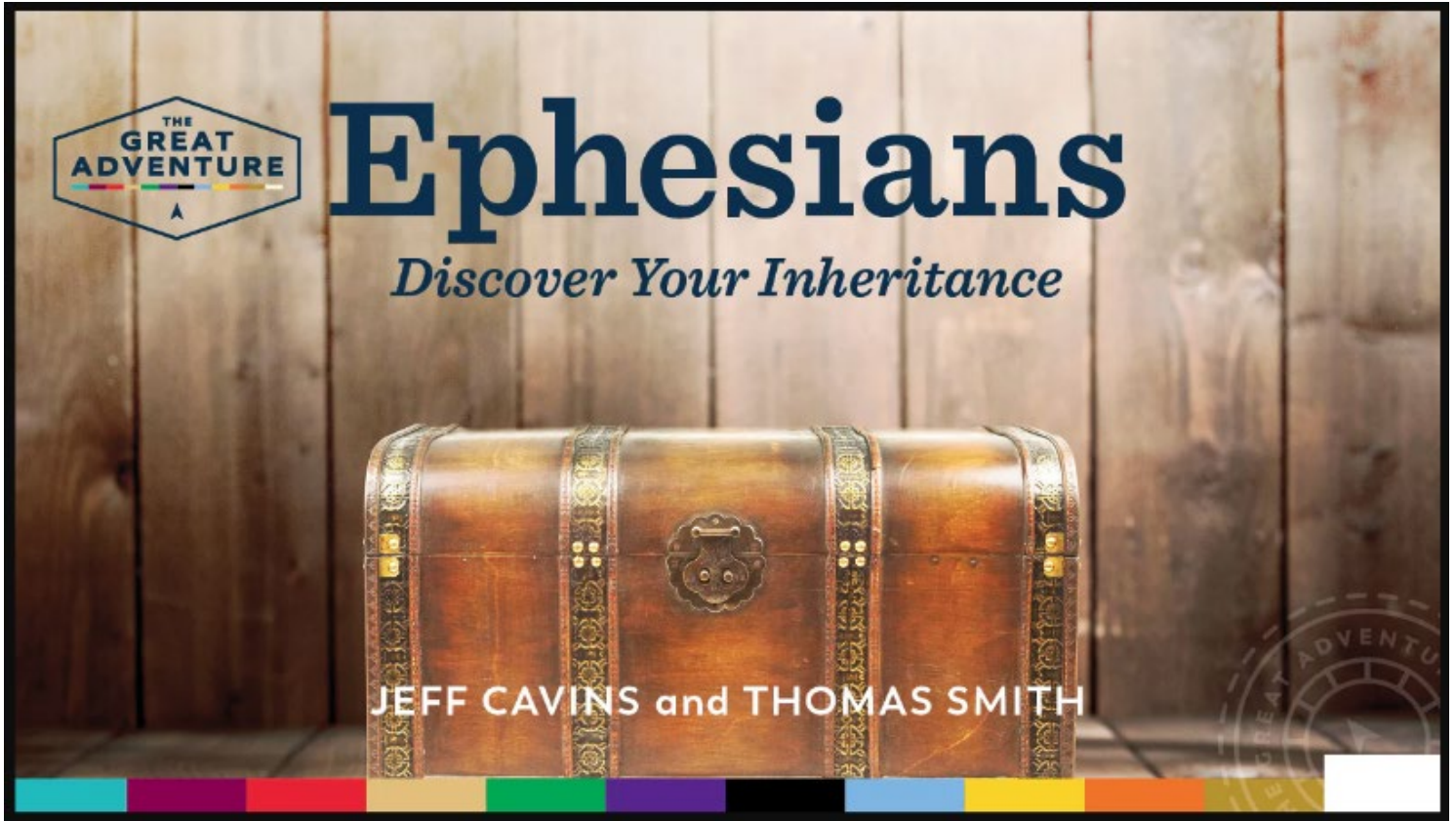

Ephesians was one of St. Paul's most widely circulated writings because of its powerful, practical instructions for disciples of Christ. In fact, its six short chapters contain some of the most discussed passages in the New Testament. *Ephesians: Discover Your Inheritance* examines several themes that are of special concern to Christians in today's culture and society—the nature of marriage, the purpose and role of the Church, the preeminence of grace in God's plan, and the reality of spiritual warfare.
