In this Jubilee Year of Mercy let us reflect on the meaning of and ways to live the works of Mercy in our daily lives.


#### **Counseling the Doubtful**

Doubt arises in our hearts when life no longer makes sense. Our sufferings make us wonder if God loves us and if He is really working in our lives. We sometimes beg God to make the pain in our lives stop and when it does not change our doubts increase, threatening to destroy our faith. Counseling the doubtful usually involves accompanying a suffering human being in friendship. Through this friendship, we listen to the other's struggles in faith, bringing hope through presence. We attempt to find parallels between the other's story and the story of Christ so that we may see how our lives are connected to salvation history. As Jesus' suffering and death led to resurrection so our sufferings also lead to future glory. The more we share our own story of faith with others the more we will see how, in times of doubt, God's grace sustained us. In this we find the hope that makes doubt vanish.
