### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Friends in Christ,

The third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. The word 'gaudete' in Latin means 'rejoice' and the color rose of the third candle on the Advent wreath symbolizes this rejoicing.

Why does the Church invite us to rejoice on the Third Sunday of Advent? It is because of the nearness of the birth of Christ. The birth of Jesus Christ is the cause of our joy because God sent Him to save us.

Sometimes we take Jesus for granted. In order to appreciate Him more, let us take a moment to consider what it would be like for us if He had never come. If Jesus had not been born, lived among us, died and rose again, the gates of Heaven would have remained closed to us. We would not have the Eucharist. We would not know what it would mean to have our sins forgiven through Baptism or Confession. We could not be members of the Church because without Jesus there would be no Church. Also, because we are Gentiles, we might never hear of the one, true God revealed in the Old Testament to the Jews. Right now we might be worshipping pagan gods and goddesses or have no faith.

An expression that sums up what it would be like without Jesus is "No Jesus, No Peace; Know Jesus, Know Peace." Without Jesus we have no faith, no peace, no hope, no real understanding of love, no grace, no forgiveness, no full understanding of God, no hope of eternal life... and a lot of other missing things we often take for granted.

Let's rejoice in the gift of Jesus.




### **Christmas Choir Rehearsals**

Please join us after the 9:00am Mass to rehearse hymns for the Christmas Eve Mass and sing-along.


### Are you having a family gathering or holiday party?
