Blast From the Past(or) The Baptism of the Lord January 13, 2019

Dateline: The Jordan River.

This is where we conclude our Christmas Season and reflect on Jesus' being baptized by His own cousin, John. What happened to Our Lord in the Jordan is a transformative event for us and the perfect perspective from which to begin the New Year. I opened an old journal which chronicled my own visit to the Jordan River in December, 2006 with Bishop Serratelli and a bunch of priests and seminarians. How do you imagine the Jordan River? It's not what I expected. It's not a very 'mighty' river at all. I'm embarrassed to confess my immediate impressions, but I recall thinking, 'if only Evel Knievel jumped over this river instead of Snake River Canyon...' Such is the breadth of my deep wisdom and vast theological mind. But anyhoo, the Jordan is a crooked river, and not the most impressive sight to behold. But as we stepped into the river and renewed our own Baptismal promises, like we do at Baptisms of babies at Church, Bishop explained that Jesus' Baptism is His identification with us, and that 'all life is subject to the law of growth.' I like that. At the Annunciation, at the Jordan and at Cavalry, God the Father breathes the Spirit upon His Christ. So too it is with us. In his massive work, Jesus of Nazareth, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI writes that the 'real novelty of Jesus' Baptism is that He wants to be Baptized, that He blends into the gray mass of us sinners waiting on the banks of the Jordan.' As we begin a New Year, we are given the courage that comes with Our Lord's desire for us. Start your New Year off right, and end Christmas well. Contemplate Jesus at the Jordan. What happened there was for you!
