#### Blast From the Past(or) Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time February 24, 2019

Fresh off the Sermon on the Plain, the Gospel of Luke turns it up a notch this week, exhorting us to love our enemies and to do good to those who hate you. Ok, God, I am trying here, but I make no promises when I am attempting to merge on to Route 287 South from Route 80. Just vesterday a guy cut in so late that I most assuredly did not 'bless those who curse you...' I hope You did not see that, God. I was going to follow him to calmly and respectfully explain to him the error of his ways, but I didn't feel like going toward Mahwah. Also, I discovered that this driver had Pennsylvania plates, and since we all know how people from Pennsylvania drive, I had to cut him slack. They can't help it. (No offense to Pennsylvanians. My beloved Grandma, God rest her, once lived in Reading, PA, where she frequented Boscov's, but she couldn't drive a lick. ('Gram, you're in the left lane, you know that, right?')). Where was I going with this? Oh, yes, the Christian challenge of Luke Chapter 6. I've met many people who burden themselves by thinking they have to separate their Faith from their Reason in the attempt to be 'Christian.' 

I generally reserve Mondays for my personal Sabbath.
