Blast From the Past(or) Feast of the Presentation of the Lord February 2, 2020

This Child is destined for the rise and fall of many......

When Mary and Joseph bring their newborn to the temple, we gain perspective on our place in the world. The Presentation reminds us that we are not our own: All of us, even our kids, properly belong to God. This Feast is also a Big Reveal from Simeon: This Child is destined. Mary and Joseph were ecstatic on hearing that, understanding Simeon to mean that their Son would enjoy the perfect life with acceptances to the finest prep schools, becoming an academic-All-American before eventually landing the medical residency of his choice and later settling down with His stunning high school sweetheart, who herself went on to become a famous actress and best-selling author. At the Reveal, Mary and Joseph breathed easy and then invited everyone to the Post-Presentation after-party brunch at this really trendy place near Galilee. And shuttles ran from the Temple every 15 minutes so everyone could have a good time. Wait-you know what? I think I may be reading the wrong story. My bad. Wow, that's awkward. Anyway...Simeon actually reveals that this Baby will suffer and be contradicted by the world. Even this Child's mother will be pierced with a sword. Belonging to God includes our share in the Cross of this Christ, in Whose suffering we are redeemed. No one likes to suffer, but it is organic to Christ Himself. In Salvifici Doloris, St. John Paul II wrote, suffering is a universal theme that accompanies man at every point on earth (SD 2). For the Christian, the meaning and purpose our suffering is exposed in the Presentation. This does not mean we are masochists. This means that our lives are not, ultimately, about us. Thanks be to God, they're much bigger than that.
