Blast From the Past(or) First Sunday of Lent March 1, 2020

Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted....

Did I read that correctly? Is this the same Spirit Who rested upon Jesus in the form of a dove at His baptism? Is this the same Jesus Who taught us to pray, lead us not in to temptation? That can't be right. In fact, the Bible tells us elsewhere that He Himself does not tempt anyone (James 2:13). This confusion calls for the powerful words of the famed skeptic and master theologian, Arnold Jackson: Watchoo talkin' bout, Willis? And so Lent commences with this paradox: Faith is exposed in trial. God's Spirit breathed into Adam does not inoculate him from the serpent. God's chosen people Israel were not spared the desert, and even Jesus willingly experienced despair as He suffocated on the Cross: My God, My God, why have You forsaken me (Matt 27:46). God does not delight in our failure. But, in frailty our Faith is forged. Hey, we've all known need, discomfort and alienation. I once got lost in Gary, Indiana. At night. I've seen the movie Glitter with Mariah Carey. I've been to the Paramus Park Mall. Heck, I am a life-long Mets fan. All these things are tortuous moments of trial that prove one's mettle. Perhaps we enter Lent weak, tired, tempted and in need of a change. May the next 40 days of little Lenten sacrifices remind us that in our heartache, challenges and temptations, Jesus has been led to the desert to be with us. Lent well, because God loves
