During this Month of May, We Celebrate Our Blessed Mother in a Special Way

While we celebrate our earthly mothers next week, the Church has for centuries celebrated our Heavenly Mother throughout this month of May. It is a time when we are called to especially honor and seek the intercession of Mary as the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church. May has long been honored as the season of the beginning of new life. In Ancient Greece, May was dedicated to Artemis, the goddess of fecundity. In Roman Culture, May was dedicated to Flora, the goddess of blooms. The tradition of honoring Mary was initially not tied to the month of May, but was part of a celebration called Tricesimum or "Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary," which was held from August 15 to September 14. However, in medieval times, the notion of dedicating a specific month to Mary, with daily spiritual exercises in her honor, was tied to May. This became especially widespread during the nineteenth century and continues today. So as you say your daily prayers this May, it's the perfect time to take maybe just an extra moment, following the path of many devoted Catholics before us, to give thanks to our Blessed Mother for her unfailing love and intercession, and to continue to place our lives in her care.


