Blast from the Past(or) Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time June 18, 2023

"...I bore you up on eagle's wings and brought you here to Myself..."

All the readings today emphasize God's Fatherly Provision, and they echo the sentiment of this Father's Day! Their overarching theme is inescapable: God the Father takes care of us. St. Paul challenges us to be grateful for this fact, reminding us that God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. That's some quality paternal care for ya', giving His Life. I won't even give people my special Overstock discount code. Nope. Can't have it. Don't even ask. This 15% off is offered exclusively for me, all special-like. Overstock knows where their bread is buttered, and so they treat me with that personal touch befitting of such a VIP. Thankfully, God's Fatherly care does not mirror my stinginess. In fact, God's love is exhaustive, inexhaustible and inclusive of all people. Sadly, ours is a culture seemingly resentful of such, with the month of June being an interesting example. Pride, it would be helpful for us to recall, is long-known by Christians as the first and deadliest of sins. The snake. The tree. You get it. Remember? Thus Eden continues. Pride is history's first rejection of God's gift, and so the rainbow is a poorly-coopted banner for self-focus. Instead, for the Christian, the rainbow is a symbol of God's Covenant and Fatherly Provision. Our state religion of pride attempts to replace the religion of God's humility. This coming week we celebrate the Feast of our Patronal Father in St. Thomas More. We'll have Mass, followed by Adoration until noon, in honor of a man for all seasons who opposed the state religion of his time in the silence of conscience. For this he lost his head. St. Thomas More was a Christian husband and father whose feast ironically falls during what is known as pride month. For our Patron, Father's Day is not equated with self-assertion, but with gratitude of God's Fatherly Provision. Happy Father's Day to our earthly fathers, and our Father in heaven as well.

Celebrating the Feast Day of our Patron, Saint Thomas More

This coming Thursday, June 22, is the Feast Day of our Patron, Saint Thomas More, Saint Thomas More was born in London in 1478, and after years of studying, and even considering priesthood, lived out his vocation a lawyer, as well as a theologian and writer. He rose through the ranks of Parliament and was named Lord Chancellor in 1529. He was highly regarded by those who knew him, including those in power. While he was extremely devoted to his king, he was even more devoted to God. In a great test of his faith, St. Thomas More was challenged to publicly endorse King Henry VIII's divorce, remarriage and claim to being head of the English Church. Even his daughter begged him to support the king in order to avoid punishment as a traitor. Unable to do so, St. Thomas More resigned his position, staying true to his beliefs despite the consequences. This earned him a conviction for treason, and he was cruelly beheaded in 1535. Yet throughout this time he managed to retain his cheerful nature and gratitude to God.

To honor religious liberty and the great courage of our Patron, we will be having Adoration on his Feast Day this Thursday, beginning with Exposition at 8:30 am and concluding with Benediction at noon. All are invited to come by for even a few minutes to spend some time in prayer and reflection.
