Blast from the Past(or) Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 2, 2023

"...whoever loses his life for My sake will find it..."

Well that sounds a bit harsh, no? Aren't we trying to recruit more people? Did I hear correctly that to follow Christ requires self-denial and taking up one's Cross? I gotta be honest; I don't know if I am cut out for this 'Christianity' thing. I was looking for a more low-impact program, like perhaps one of those mini exercise bikes that I can use while sitting on the couch eating nachos and bingewatching the latest Netflix series. Is there something like that mentioned in the brochure? In the movie *Stripes*, Dewey Oxburger felt the Army would give him a free, sixto eight-week training program, which he thought would be perfect for him. How about a mid-range Christianity package that requires no prepaid deposit, offers a generous and flexible cancellation policy, and still includes the basic Unfortunately, Christianity remains an inconvenient program which includes the possibility of that whole martyrdom thing. For pain-averse folks like me, the Gospel is difficult. Christianity means that our lives are not about us. It is a calling of Christ beyond our own terms and preferences. Geez, where's the fun in that? In a society that so often encourages and even rewards selfaggrandizement, this is not a popular message. Isn't God worried about the potential for negative Yelp reviews?? Yet Christ is the contradiction to our 'selfie' culture. As Jesus's cousin said, He must increase: I must decrease. Christ shares in our brokenness and we in His. Such it is to be called Christian, to take up the Cross daily and follow Him. It takes just one little act of love, to give 'only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because he is a disciple...' To carry your Cross is to participate in the Passion. Your image is not the ego, but the Imago. This is not easy. It will cost you your life, but you will not lose your reward.
