Blast from the Past(or) Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time November 12, 2023

'Amen, I say to you; I do not know you...'

Yikes. For me, there are no more harrowing words in the Bible. This is just my personal opinion, but, wow. There it is: I do not know you. I can't imagine these are words any of us would want to hear when we face God at the end of our lives. But such is Jesus's story of the virgins waiting on the bridegroom. They have all gotten their up-dos and manicures and the trolley has pulled up, so they are ready to head out. But a funny thing happened on the way to the wedding...they passed the Rusty Scupper. And wouldn't you know, it was right at brunch time. Marcia said they just had to stop— I mean, how can you pass up hand-carved meat, made-to-order omelets and complimentary mimosas? It would only take a few minutes, and otherwise they'd have to wait until the cocktail hour to eat! So, they headed inside for a quick look-see. All was going fine and still on schedule, that is, until Marcia bumped into an old college buddy on the raw oyster bar line, and next thing you know, an hour had gone by. Now they would all be late! 
