


Mass Intentions/Mass Cards

The Epiphany of the Lord Blessing of the Home and Household on The Epiphany

The Solemnity of the Epiphany has long been the day on which Catholics bless their home and its members. The tradition is rooted in the Bible, particularly Passover, where the blood placed on the lintel of the home was a sign that protected the household within. Although offered by priests in earliest days, as the number of Catholic homes greatly increased over the years, it has become something done by members of the household themselves. The blessing is often performed by writing the letters C, M, and B and the numbers of the year in chalk on the lintel of the main doorway of the home. For instance:

20 C+M+B 24

The letters stand for the names of each of the wise men (Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar) but are also believed to stand for "Christus mansionem benedicat" (i.e. "Christ bless this house.") Below is a blessing that can be used for this age-old tradition, a beautiful way to start the New Year...

Bless, O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Your law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein.
