Blast from the Past(or) Second Sunday in Ordinary Time January 14, 2024

'Speak, Lord, Your servant is listening...'

As we enter Ordinary Time (with Ash Wednesday only a few weeks away, oh, my. Life goes too quickly!), we hear the familiar story of Samuel and Eli. Samuel wakes several times during the night, thinking that Eli had called him. The untold part of the story is that Eli said, 'Please, Samuel, go back to bed. I am binging on the last season of Yellowstone and you're interrupting!' (Little-known fact: Eli is a huge Kevin Costner fan, and really, who isn't? Costner was brilliant in *Dances with Wolves* and awesome in Field of Dreams, although I'm still a little hurt that I didn't receive so much as a phone call when they were looking for baseball greats to play on the dream field...listen, my Tee Ball career, while brief, was legendary!) My Siskel and Ebert (may they rest in peace) tangent aside, our reading from Samuel points to what Bishop Emeritus Serratelli termed the 'crisis of listening' in our culture. Eli eventually *listens*, to find that it is the Lord Who is calling him. In an Angelus address in 2013, Pope Francis said something similar, reminding us that we must listen to our conscience and not our ego. Ooh, sage advice, as we continue to navigate this New Year. Pope Francis continued, conscience is the interior grace in which we can listen and hear the Truth. Conscience must be formed. In our day, people identify themselves as wolves or walrus according to their preference. But the conscience is not about preference. It is more transformative, and speaks to our very core. Like Eli, if we take time to *listen*, we are informed and enlightened in judgment, so says the Catechism (CCC 1783, 1776-1802). It is God Himself Who speaks to your heart, which is, in the eyes of God, the heart of a child. Let us make some quiet time this year and truly listen, as God's servants, to the personal message He has for each and every one of us...
