Blast from the Past(or) Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time January 28, 2024

'Brothers and sisters, I should like you to be free of anxieties...'

St. Paul's plea to the Corinthians is helpful in our own postmodern culture which, I think we can all stipulate, is saturated by anxieties. One might wonder, why is a culture with every material comfort still somehow so anxious? Were our Depression-era forbearers this anxious? Discuss. So often our internal thoughts are foisted on others, to be accepted as reality. From the mere children who command vast social media platforms to the grown adults consumed with posting the minutiae of their lives online, we are surrounded by offerings of purported authenticities. Sometimes, though, what we wish to be real is simply not the case. And this is where angst and even despair can arise. It's a problem. For example, I have for vears desired to get my chance on *Dancing with the Stars*. The long hallway in the rectory provides the perfect runway for me to practice my moves, and Father Daniel provides good critique. However, when he told me that I was unlikely to get the call from the producers, being neither a professional dancer nor a 'celebrity,' I grew quite anxious, despondent and even frustrated with him. There was a painful chasm between my thoughts and my reality. A long time ago, a guy proposed, I think, therefore I am. Such ushered years of anxieties, to which St. John Paul II offered a corrective centuries later: It is more proper to say, 'I am, therefore I think' (St. John Paul II, Crossing the Threshold of Hope). As we absorb the Gospel of Mark, we see the man with the unclean spirit who kind of exemplifies our own worry. His question, have you come to destroy us reveals hope in his own self-sufficiency. I do this All. The. Time. And it always leads to despair. The man's question shows anxiety even in the Presence of God Himself! I've been there, too! Our true reality is our identity as the Image and Likeness of God. In a world of anxiety, let us cast aside our delusions of self-sufficiency and our constructed realities. Let us instead proclaim, 'I know Who You Are, Jesus of Nazareth. You are my Portion and my Cup, my Life, my Love and my deepest Desire!' Have no anxiety at all. May we be freed of such in Christ Jesus amongst the unknown.
