Blast from the Past(or) Third Sunday of Lent March 3, 2024

He Himself understood it well...

After 'cleaning house' in the Temple with His whip of cords, Jesus spoke to the people about the Temple of His Body. Be He did 'not trust Himself to them because He knew them all.' There are many iterations of Gandhi's quote, I like Christ, but I'm not so fond of Christians, i.e. I love God, but I have problems with His children. Such is the result of this frustrating and indelible mark of the nature we refer to as 'human.' We ourselves know well this 'human nature'...the one which fails to return shopping carts, instead leaving them to take up a perfectly good parking spot. Guide to Confession

Are you considering going to Confession this Lent, but feeling a little nervous? Maybe it's been a little while...or a long while. Or maybe you're just not sure what to say or where to even start. There is no need to be afraid! The Sacrament of Reconciliation is intended as one of healing, not of fear. Below is a little guide from our Diocese to help you get started and point you in the right direction. Just remember, Jesus is waiting for you with open arms!

Prepare

Pray to the Holy Spirit for the wisdom to know your sins and the courage to confess them. Take a look at an Examination of Conscience for guidance.

Begin

Start with the sign of the cross and tell the priest how long it's been since you last went to Confession. If it's been a while, that's okay, just let the priest know.

Confess

Name all of the sins that come to mind based on your Examination of Conscience.

Listen

Listen to the advice the priest gives you based on your confession. Remember the Penance he gives you, which is to be completed after your confession.

Pray

Pray the Act of Contrition. There are a few versions. Use whichever one you remember. If you have forgotten, don't worry. Tell the priest and he will help you through it.

Be Forgiven

Be attentive as the priest prays the Prayer of Absolution. Respond, "Amen," and rejoice in knowing that your sins are completely forgiven.

Go in Peace

The priest will conclude with, "Your sins are forgiven, go in peace," or similar words. Respond, "Thanks be to God!"


