### Blast from the Past(or) Fifth Sunday of Lent March 17, 2024

'Sir, we would like to see Jesus...'

Well, that cuts to the Christian quick, doesn't it? This end of Lent conflates us with the end of our Faith: we all want to be put in touch with Jesus Christ. What's interesting is that this request came from foreigners, 'Greeks' who came to the Passover Feast. Yup, the 'outsiders,' like SE Hinton's classic novel of the same name (one of my favorite books as a kid), desired the Faith. That the recounting of this request falls on St. Patrick's Day is interesting since, as a slave, he, too was a proverbial 'outsider' (little-known fact— St. Patrick was actually Italian...sure, scoff if you will; I'm just here to fill any gaps in your knowledge of history). In celebration of this day, I usually do my Riverdance routine in the rectory. While festive, it does bring back some painful memories, as I actually auditioned for the show and of course nailed it. Yet for reasons unknown, they chose some guy named Michael Flatley instead. Whatev. Their loss! Anywho, whether 'Iew or Greek, slave or free,' Christ's attraction is all-encompassing and exhaustive. The above appeal was directed to Philip, not because he merely knew about Jesus. Instead, he *knew* Jesus and so was asked to arrange the meeting all Christians desire. When we are inspired by, or attracted to, someone, we long to be introduced to them by those who know them best. Christianity is the difference between knowing about something and truly knowing someone: a Person! Channel your inner Philip this Lent and cultivate your personal relationship with Christ in some moments of silent prayer and Sacramental life. Our world-gone-nutty is clamoring to meet Jesus. We can be Philip and bring someone to Him. To help inspire these efforts, we can recall some parts of the breastplate of our hero, St. Patrick, today: *Christ with me*, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me...Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me...

#### Where Did the Statues Go??

As you entered our church this week, you likely noticed something— our statues and images have been covered in purple cloths. But why? Why do we cover items intended to raise our hearts and minds to heaven, especially at this reflective time? It may seem counterintuitive, yet the practice of veiling alerts us that something is different. During these last two weeks of Lent, called "Passiontide," the Church shifts her focus from Christ in the desert to Christ during His Passion. When such familiar and cherished images are hidden, we are shaken up. If our Ash Wednesday fervor has perhaps dissipated a bit as the weeks of Lent have carried on, veiling wakes us up. It is a forceful reminder that the Sacred Triduum is near, and it is time for us to get ready! No matter how we may feel our Lent has gone so far, it is time not to look back but to look ahead and prepare with great hope for what is to come. It is not too late to approach our Lord and seek His mercy! Our brokenness and our own 'veiled' lives keep us in exile from our God and our true home. And so we approach the upcoming Easter Triduum with even greater anticipation, not only of the unveiling of these beautiful images, but of that greatest unveiling through Christ's Holy Cross and Resurrection, by which He has redeemed the world.


