We pray as a Church for our Cardinals, who will soon be gathering to elect our next pope. Beginning immediately after the 8:15 am Mass on Wednesday, May 7 (the first day of the Conclave), we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the church. This will continue (outside of Mass) until the new pope is elected. All are welcome to spend some time with Jesus in prayer for the guidance of the Holy Spirit—upon the electors, upon our Church and upon our new pope to come.



The Conclave Commences...

For the first time in 13 years, the Cardinals of our Church will gather in Rome this week to select a new pope. It will be the first time in 20 years that a pope will be elected upon the passing of the prior pontiff.

When will the conclave begin?

The conclave will begin this Wednesday, May 7.

Where will it take place?

The conclave will take place in the Sistine Chapel, with its famous frescos painted by Michelangelo surrounding the Cardinals. Every papal election since 1878 has occurred there. All doors and windows are closed and locked, and everyone, including all of the Cardinals, will be checked to make sure there are no electronic devices. As the conclave begins, the Master of Ceremonies will shout, "Extra omnes!" a Latin phrase meaning, "Everyone else out!" A Swiss guard is posted The participants are not allowed any outside. outside communications. During the conclave, the Cardinals will stay at the Domus Sanctae Marthae, a guesthouse on the edge of Vatican City. It is a short bus ride or walk from the Sistine Chapel.

Who gets to vote?

Not all Cardinals are eligible to vote for Pope Francis's successor. Only Cardinals who were under the age of 80 at the time of Pope Francis's passing may cast a ballot. Of the current 252 Cardinals, 135 are eligible to vote.

How are the ballots cast and counted?

Each Cardinal will place a hand on the Gospels and swear to uphold the rules and secrecy of the conclave. At the time of each vote, the Cardinals will handwrite their choice for the next pope on a ballot that reads, "Eligo in Summum Pontificem" which means, "I elect as the Supreme Pontiff..." Each ballot is cast individually into special urns and then counted by hand by 3 scrutineers whose work is checked by 3 revisers, all of whom are selected by lot at the start of the conclave. Each ballot is read


aloud (without the name of the elector). The last scrutineer pokes a needle through each ballot at the word "Eligo" and places it on a thread so they are all secured.

How many votes will there be?

Typically there is one vote on the first day. If subsequent votes are needed, there are usually 2 in the morning and 2 in the evening each of the following days until there is a successful vote. A 2/3 majority is required for the election of a new pope. If no one has been elected after 13 days, voting is suspended and the Cardinals will spend a day in additional prayer and discourse before voting resumes. There is then a runoff between the 2 Cardinals who received the most votes on the previous ballots (and those Cardinals do not vote).

How will we know the results?

A chimney is installed on the roof of the Sistine Chapel before the conclave. After each vote, the ballots and all related notes, etc. are placed into a stove in the back corner of the chapel and burned in the morning and in the evening. If the vote has not reached the required majority, the resulting smoke will appear black, with the help of a special chemical. If the 2/3 majority has been met, the smoke will appear white, also through addition of a special chemical. If the chosen individual accepts this election, he will choose the name he will take as pope, and the senior cardinal deacon will then proclaim from the central balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, "Habemus Papam!" that is, "We have a pope!!" After this announcement, the pope's name will be announced, and he will appear on the balcony to impart his first Papal blessing.
