Celebrating the Feast Day of our Patron, Saint Thomas More

June 22 is the Feast Day of our Patron, Saint Thomas More. Since this year June 22 falls on a Sunday, the celebration of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ supersedes his feast. But, it's still important to honor and remember him on this day. Here are a few basic facts:

Birthday: February 7, 1478 in London, England

Date of Death: July 6, 1535 in London, England

Feast Day: June 22

Education: St. Anthony's School and Oxford University

<u>Famous Last Words:</u> "The King's good servant -- but God's first."

<u>Known as Patron Saint of</u>: Attorneys, Civil Servants, Court Clerks, Politicians, Public Servants, Statesmen, Difficult Marriages, Adopted Children, Widowers

Saint Thomas More was born in London in 1478, and after years of studying, and even considering priesthood, lived out his vocation a lawyer, as well as a theologian and writer. He rose through the ranks of Parliament and was named Lord Chancellor in 1529. He was highly regarded by those who knew him, including those in power. While he was extremely devoted to his king, he was even more devoted to God. In a great test of his faith, St. Thomas More was challenged to publicly endorse King Henry VIII's divorce, remarriage and claim to being head of the English Church. Even his daughter begged him to support the king in order to avoid punishment as a traitor. Unable to do so, St. Thomas More resigned his position, staying true to his beliefs despite the consequences. This earned him a conviction for treason, and he was cruelly beheaded in 1535. Yet throughout this time he managed to retain his cheerful nature and gratitude to God. May we draw inspiration from his holy example.

To buy the time again that I have lost. To abstain from vain conversations. To shun foolish mirth and gladness. To cut off unnecessary recreations.

Of worldly substance, friends, liberty, life and all, to set the loss at naught, for the winning of Christ.

To think my worst enemies my best friends, for the brethren of Joseph could never have done him so much good with their love and favour as they did him with their malice and hatred.

These minds are more to be desired of every man than all the treasures of all the princes and kings, Christian and heathen, were it gathered and laid together all in one heap.

12th Annual Corpus Christi Food Drive

Catholic Charities Food Pantries help more people today than they ever have in their 80+ year history, approximately 20,000 people each month. During the summer months, this need becomes even more critical, as children are out of school and miss out on the two daily meals they typically receive during the academic year. While the holiday season brings generous support from many, the summer months present a great challenge. With many families on vacation, the needs of the food insecure often fade from public attention. Last year's Corpus Christi Food Drive resulted in the collection of over 15,000 pounds of food for the 3 Catholic Charities food pantries: Fr. English in Paterson, Hope House in Dover and Partnership for Social Services in Franklin. Your generosity helped keep their shelves stocked. But a new season is upon us and the great need continues. Due to the ongoing, unprecedented food pantry requests from the local poor, Bishop Sweeney has again authorized a Diocesan-wide food collection in all parishes on the weekend of the Feast of Corpus Christi. Each parish has been asked to collect specific food and household items to keep these pantries full again this summer. St. Thomas More has been asked to provide Canned Meals such as beef stew, chili and Chef Boyardee. We would appreciate it if you could please bring only these items so we can help meet the specific needs of these pantries. The collection will take place **THIS WEEKEND**, June 21-22 only. 
