

Wow! Where does one begin? Three groups of children made their First Holy Communion last Saturday, each one innocent and filled with anticipation. Each girl looked beautiful in her white dress, and each boy looked handsome in his suit.

We thank their teachers, Sister Bridget Harakal, Mrs. Kathy D'Antonio, Mrs. Ivette Valori, Mrs. Diane Capone & Miss Eva Marie Solangon for all the time and effort involved in teaching and preparing them for the reception of this spiritually nourishing sacrament. How wonderful it is that they now have Jesus to rely upon and guide them in a special way from this day forward.

We are grateful to **Ivette Valori, Gail Mono-chello**, and **Sister Bridget Harakal f**or guiding them in their rehearsals. All three ceremonies were flawless, a great credit to the parents, the teachers, and the new communicants.

The following day, we had a May procession and Crowning of our Blessed Mother. Both our First Communicants and the members of our Rosary Altar Society walked in procession. The arch which surrounded the statue of the Blessed Mother was decorated beautifully, and the President of our Rosary Altar Society, **Kathy D'Antonio** helped to honor the Blessed Mother with a beautiful crown of roses donated by **Adelaide Fiorarancio**.

The singing was terrific! Somehow, we never forget those Marian hymns we learned in our youth, and they are always sung with great gusto and enthusiasm.

On last Sunday, we also celebrated the Feast of Pentecost, the third greatest feast in the liturgical year. At the 10:15 Mass, the first reading was proclaimed in Italian by **Angelo Renzulli**. The second reading was proclaimed in Spanish by **Alcira Castro**, and the Gospel was proclaimed in English.

To reflect the universality of the Church, the Prayer of the Faithful was read in various languages by the people of St. James. Tagalog, spoken in the Philippines, was read by **Jasmin Figueroa**; Italian was read by **Matilda Sabatino**; Arabic by **Hajaleh Balloutine**; Polish by **Michael Cielemecki**; Spanish by **Frances Rodriguez**; and English by **Diane Emmolo**.

It was an uplifting Mass with the Parish Council and parish organizations represented. Our Religious Education Program and the Academy of St. Francis of Assisi students participated as well. Many parishioners were able to observe, perhaps for the first time, how diverse our parish is and how enriched

we are because of our diversity. How boring it would be if we were all the same.

After the last Mass, the Annual Vivere Christus Award ceremony was held at St. Philip's Church in Clifton. Until the necessary repairs are completed on our Cathedral, St. John's, in Paterson, almost all significant ceremonies are being held at St. Philip's.

In any case, the Church was filled to overflowing as the generous recipients of the diocese were acknowledged and affirmed for their selflessness and hard work shared via a multitude of ministries in the diocese. The recipient of this year's award, **Janet Cozzolino**, was most deserving of it, and we thank her for all she does for our parish. (cf insert)

We celebrate our parish's 90th Anniversary this week at the 12 noon Mass with a luncheon reception to follow. We remember all those who have gone before us, whose sacrifices allow us to enjoy all that is here today. Walk around and appreciate the sacrifices of so many who, through their generosity, found the wherewithall to build a Church, which later became a school, a "new" Church, a Parish House, and a convent. All are beautiful brick buildings which have endured bad weather, storms, hurricanes, floods, blizzards, and the like.

If it were not for their love of God and the sacrifices they so unselfishly made, who knows where this parish might be today. Pray for all those who contributed in any way, and some in a multitude of ways, to Father Francis Reilly's "invitations" (a multitude of invitations) to get this place on its feet and functioning. We pray that the next 90 years might be as good as the first 90 have already been.

The interior renovation of St. James of the Marches Church took place between November 2013 and May 10, 2015.

It was a slow process, but the results were well worth the timing and planning involved.

Recently, a beautiful new marble altar of sacrifice replaced the wooden altar which had been used for years. The marble altar has the Last Supper depicted on the front side. The marble perfectly matched the original high altar, in place since the Church was built.

The floor of the sanctuary was reconfigured, and is now marble and matches both altars.

So, today, our Church welcomes all who come with an open heart seeking the God of Mankind, Source of Life. As a faith-filled community, we join together in prayer because we know He is here.
