

Thinking Out Loud

At this last meeting, the Knights of Columbus, the Rosary Altar Society, the Boy Scouts, Seniors, Ushers, Liturgy Committee, and Grandfriends were represented. The Principal of our school, the Director of our Religious Education, and the Pastoral Associate were all present.

Ginny Andreano is our President, **Janet Cozzolino** serves as Secretary, and **Arlene Festa** is our Vice President. We are fortunate, indeed, in having such committed and dedicated representatives on the Council, as we do. All members work hard to make our parish the active and involved one it is.

In the "Thanks Column," we are grateful to **Jake Grecco** for the donation of new wicker collection baskets. Jake is always so generous in his taking of photos of events of our parish and now for these collection baskets.

We are also grateful to one of our sacristans, **Antonio Vacca**, who had several vestments dry cleaned for us. The more a vestment is worn, the more obvious it looks worn. It is kind of Antonio to not only notice the spots but to have them removed.

Last Sunday, we had a welcome reception for new members of our parish in the Religious Education office. All organizations and most of the staff were able to be there to welcome the newest members of our parish. It was a warm and pleasant gathering.

We have an entire new group of flowers surrounding our Church and the front of our school, thanks to ever-faithful **Ray Ricciardi** and **Steve Nagy**. When our good Bishop was here for the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Bishop commented how beautiful both the outside and the inside of our Church looked.

Hopefully, before the month of June is over, our new pulpit will be in place, and it is absolutely gorgeous. It matches perfectly the new Altar of Sacrifice given in memory of **Shafiq D. Handal**, and the new altar is a match to the high altar upon which the tabernacle rests.

Also, we are hoping that the new shrine of the Pieta will be in place by that time. Both the statue and its base are striking in appearance and will be a most welcomed addition to our Church. We are in the process of selecting the correct lighting and candle stand for this project.

In last week's bulletin, a college in Florida was mentioned in regards to poor behavior on the part of many of its graduates who booed down its commencement speaker. Graduates there turned their backs and made so much noise that the President of the University had to threaten those students with not receiving their diplomas at the ceremony unless their boorish behavior ended.

Last week, the Vice President of the United States, **Mike Pence**, spoke at the University of Notre Dame graduation. Sure enough, some of the graduates got up and walked out when the Vice President began to speak. At least jeering was not a part of their protest.

The reporting of this protest was as interesting as the protest itself. *The New York Times* reported "a large crowd of students walked out," while the *Chicago Tribune* wrote that, "some graduating students" left. *Breitbart News* reported over "one hundred students" walked out. Somewhere in the reporting by the press, there were "facts" and "alternative facts" given to those who were not present to see for themselves.

It is not surprising, then, that so many Americans are confused by the press and no longer trust in it. Shame on the media for the spin so many of its reporters put on the reports for their readers. Whatever happened to honesty, clarity, and integrity?

On a more pleasant front, our own **Gordon Geiger**, reader, choir member, Senior and Boy Scout leader is being honored by the Boy Scouts for the decades and decades of self-giving and heart-felt work he has given to hundreds upon hundreds of the young men in this fine group.

Honoring **Mr. Geiger** on June 7, 2017 at the Barn Yard, the Boy Scouts will say a well-deserved "Thank You" to this man who has done so much for so many. Gordon was a 2014 recipient of the Angels of Light Award from this parish. Congratulations, Gordon, for a life time of service to the Boy Scouts.






