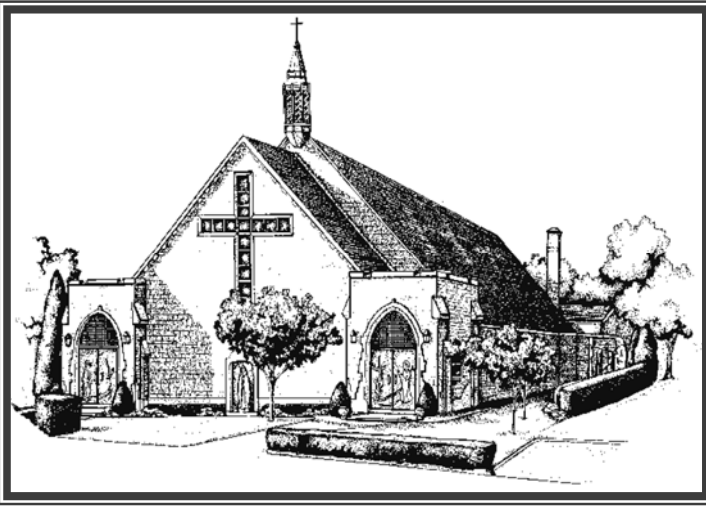

The Sacrament of Baptism

Celebrated on the **Second** and **Fourth Sunday** of each month immediately **AFTER the 10:15 am Mass**

Parents should contact the Parish House either before or soon after the birth of the baby to register for the reception of the Sacrament.

Instruction for parents and godparents are held by appointments. Parents and godparents are expected to be practicing Catholics; godparent must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to serve as sponsors.

Thinking Out Loud



A parish and its activities often reflect the academic year. Events peak in June, slow down a bit and, at times, almost come to a halt during the months of July and August.

At present, we are in the middle of our Father's Day Novena, where we remember those men in our lives who have helped to mold and shape us. A pattern here can be noticed that many more remember spiritual intentions for their mothers than they do for their fathers. A social scientist might have a field day analyzing this practice, but it is easier to simply offer the observation.

For the past fifteen days, responsibilities have literally been non-stop, going from one event to another. Appointments have been continual, and every day seems to fly by, sometimes not allowing time to keep up with all that should be taken care of, and then some.

A week ago Tuesday, our 8th Grade had their dinner dance at the Brownstone House. It was a nice gathering, and all our students looked older in their gowns and suits than they do in their uniforms.

The next day, Sister Laura who is the Provincial Superior of the Franciscan Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, of which our own Sister Anne Matthew is a member, came down for a tour of our school and convent, and had lunch with us in the Parish House. Sister Anne Matthew is our vice-principal, teacher of religion, coordinates our children's liturgy, and does so many other things for us.

Right after that, it was down to the Cathedral for a final meeting of the re-dedication of the Cathedral Committee. Everyone is looking forward to the re-dedication of the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. So much work has gone into it, and those responsible for its renovation have eyes for detail. Every bit of it is impressive!

The next day, some of our students went to the Environmental and Cultural Center at the Meadowlands. Our younger students were treated to the experience of a traveling petting zoo which happened in the Parish House's backyard. The youngsters viewed everything from llamas to newborn chicks. It was quite an experience for many of them!

We had Pre-school Graduation, the kindergarten moving-up ceremony, and Graduation for our 8th Grade at the Saturday night vigil Mass.

Last Monday, our Seniors group had a wonderful farewell luncheon for Sister Mary Cecile, C.S.J.B., their ever-faithful moderator. (We will have more on Sister Mary Cecile in a later bulletin.) President Bob Gremillot, his good wife, Barbara, and his oldest son, Todd, decorated the meeting room in the Religious Education office, and his daughter, Regina, was responsible for the cost of the gathering. Re-

gina's generosity comes all the way from Houston.

Our young students went to the Turtle Back Zoo while the older ones were treated to a field day.

Monday evening, our Knights of Columbus had a dinner and gave out a number of scholarships and awards to a number of students. The Knights are the last word on generosity.

Monsignor Eugene Boland, our Pastor Emeritus, was present and looking wonderful. It was good to have him back home.

Tuesday, along with the day's work in the Parish, included a Mass for seminarians at St. Gerard's sponsored by the Serra Club. **Bishop Serratelli** celebrated the Mass, and our seminarian, Nestor Martinez, was one of three seminarians who assisted.

Bill Marmo, Rosemarie and Jim Aulino, Marty Sweeney, and Kathy D'Antonio are members of the Serra Club which assists seminarians on their journey both spiritually and financially.

The Mass was followed by a terrific dinner at the Brownstone House.

This week's activities include a wedding rehearsal on Thursday, followed by a Memorial Mass and evening appointments, the wedding on Friday, along with activities associated with the Cathedral, and other appointments.

Saturday morning is the re-dedication of the Cathedral, and this ceremony should bring us past noon. Confessions will be heard at four, the vigil Mass celebrated at 5:30 pm, and a 50th anniversary Mass at 6:30 pm. Sunday's schedule includes three Masses and a baptism after the 10:15 am and another after the 12:00 noon Mass. God is good!

Our seminarian, Nestor Martinez, will be going back to Columbia the beginning of July. He has not been home in over two years, a long time to be away from one's family.

In case you haven't heard, our efforts this weekend will go towards helping Nestor and his family whose house was destroyed in a mud slide. Viewing recent photos of the area, one can only wonder how families manage to survive such incredible devastation and move beyond such utterly heartbreaking circumstances. Yet, Nestor is always smiling and always seems to be at peace.

The myriad events and activities here at St. James should remind us that we are a parish family in the truest sense of the word. We come together to share joy with one another, to embrace watershed moments, and to fold our arms around each other in times when safety and assurances are needed. We create, together, a place of comfort, understanding, and support. That is what a home is, and that is who we are. And I thank God, daily, that it is so at St. James.

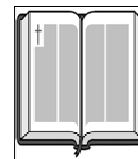

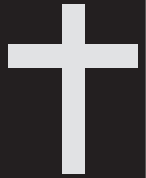
