The following items were discussed at the Tuesday, April 8, 2025, Council meeting:

**Grand Knight's Report:** Thanks to DGK Piorkowski for putting together the attached listing of events/projects our Council is working on or are upcoming. Please review, put them on your calendar, and consider volunteering for/participating in one or more of them.

**Treasurer's report:** No report. Status as of the March meeting: General Account: Current balance of \$1,456.07. Charity Fund: Current balance of \$5,693.25.

## **Committee Reports:**

**Scholarship:** An announcement regarding this year's \$1,000 Council scholarship will be placed in upcoming bulletins. The application due date is the end of May. Brothers Laverty, Zelner, Thompson, and Patterson will again serve on the Committee this year and will meet in early June to review applications and make an award recommendation to the Council. Information on the State scholarship process will also be published in a future bulletin. It was noted that the State's scholarship application timeline is different from our Council's (applications are not due until the end of the calendar year for the following year). Each State scholarship is for \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year over four years) and there are only two awardees from our District so it is very competitive.

**Harvest Festival/Car Show:** This year's Lewisburg Car Show is June 7th (rain date is June 8th) and our Council will again sell french fries and drinks. Details will be finalized at our Council's May business meeting. Heller's will not be approached to provide propane for the Car Show so as not to jeopardize their donation for the Harvest Festival (we do not expect to use as much gas for the Car Show and will depend on using Council member's personal small tanks). The location remains the same as last year (Fairfield Dealership off of Route 15). Brothers are asked to block out time on their schedules to help out. Brother Zelner noted that we do not typically get info on the Harvest Festival until around July. We do have the date for this year which is noted on the list of upcoming events (September 13, 2025). All members of our Council are encouraged to put both dates on their calendars since maximum participation is needed.

**Retention Committee:** The Deputy Grand Knight and Financial Secretary will meet in the near future to discuss removal of inactive members from our Council's roles. DKG Piorkowski noted that to move this process forward the State wants the Chairman of the Retention Committee to submit any requests for removal of members from our Council.

## Old business:

**Chance of a Lifetime (COAL) raffle tickets**: Thanks to all who helped sell tickets after weekend Masses. Our Council sold 216 tickets, which provided \$540 to our Council's Charity fund. Since our Council exceeded the minimum of 75 tickets sold, the children of Council members are eligible to apply for the State's annual scholarship.

**Special Olympics Collection:** Thanks to all who helped with the Special Olympics Collection after the March 15/16 Masses. Your efforts helped us raise \$705 that was forwarded to the Special Olympics Pennsylvania.

Our Council provided the meal for the **March 27th Newman House (CCM) Thursday night dinner** (pierogies, kielbasa, apple sauce, and green beans). Thanks to Brothers Zelner, Laverty, Mahoney, and Patterson for helping to prepare and serve the meal. Final costs for the food provided are still being tabulated and will be reported at a future meeting (for historical reference).

Thanks to those who participated in saying the March 30th Rosary at Sacred Heart Church.

**Summer festival at Saints Cyril & Methodius**: The Sisters have requested help from our Council for their 50th annual Summer Festival. The Festival will be held on Saturday, July 12, 2025 (9 or 10 AM until 5 PM). Please contact one of the Council officers or respond to this email if you can help out.

Annual Summer Picnic: Our Council is planning to have our annual summer family picnic on Sunday, June 1, 2025 at 1:30 PM at the St. Joseph Parish pavilion. Hot dogs, hamburgers, and drinks will be provided and those attending are asked to bring a side dish/dessert to share. We hope as many Council members and their families as possible will attend. An email to all Council members needs to be sent out asking those who are planning to attend to respond with the number of family members and a side dish they will bring. It was suggested that the email provide a deadline of May 20th for responses. Availability of the pavilion on June 1st also needs to be verified.
