CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP: OUR SPIRITUALITY

"Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men". When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him

The gospel writers make it clear that the response by the

disciples to the call of Jesus was immediate, urgent and unconditional. "They left everything and followed Him." In Baptism, we too have become His disciples! For Jesus said: "For John (the Baptist) baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." We have been made a holy people, a priestly people, commissioned by the Spirit to proclaim Christ the Son of God who has saved us from sin and death in his glorious resurrection.

Everything we say and do after we have said 'yes' to Jesus can be called the "spirituality of stewardship". We have been gifted beyond measure. We return a portion of what we have been given in humble service; to support the ministry of the gospel.

Everything that we have, and all that we are comes from our loving and gracious God. **As disciples of the Lord, Christ is our top priority.** We take seriously Jesusø words - "Give as the Lord has given to you...." (Luke 6.38)

From the very beginning of our day, when we offer a simple prayer of praise and thanksgiving- to the end of our day when we offer bedtime praise, we want God to have center place in our lives.

"With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow before God the most high?" (Micah 6. 6)

Every week during Mass, after we have heard the word of God in the Scripture and the homily, professed our faith, and offered prayers for our church and for the world, the ushers take up the offertory collection. The Church tells us that it is both "for the work of the church and the care of the poor." This is truly a holy action of prayer.

These financial gifts (most of them gift wrapped in their *stewardship envelopes*) are collected. Representative members of our assembly bring our money and bread and wine to the altar.

The bread and wine will become for us the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ as divine food for our spiritual journey, to transform us and as a consequence the world in which we live. Our money will be used to fuel the mission of the church.

This sacrificial offering has always been part of the Eucharist. In ancient times coins would have been accompanied with food - homegrown and handmade. The food and the money would be set aside for distribution after Mass to the church poor and needy. Today, your charitable giving supports all of our parish ministries at St. Kilian: Outreach and social services, faith formation and preparation for the sacraments, liturgy and music, the ongoing upkeep and maintenance of our parish buildings, and the salaries and benefits for the parish staff.

The communion of saints whom we honor this weekend, were passionately in love with Christ. Some were martyred for the faith. They gave all they had. We seek to follow their way of holiness. During the Offertory of the Mass we offer back to God the "first fruits" of our work week. We offer the choice portion of what we have received. The giving of alms and service to others has always extended beyond the worship experience. Consider donating the first hour or two of your work week. If you're retired, move a step closer to the biblical goal of 5% of your retirement income to St. Kilian annually (if yougre at 1% go to 1.5 or 2% ó and 5% to other charities of your choosing (second collection envelopes ó Propagation of the Faith, CHD, CRS, CMA, etc.). "When I was hungry you gave me food...." (Matthew 25)

Placing gifts before the altar represents the powerful connection between giving our very selves to God, as did the saints, and receiving in return God himself in a Holy Communion.

We give in imitation of Jesus, the one who surrendered himself in loving thanksgiving on the wood of the cross, and destroyed the power of death in his Resurrection.

"The choicest first fruits of your soil you shall bring into the house of the Lord, your God." (Exodus 23. 19)


Monday, November 2nd

Matrimony - Marriage arrangements should be made with a deacon or priest at least six months before the proposed wedding date. No dates for marriage will be given over the phone. *Note:* The interview to schedule the marriage date at St. Kilian should be completed before commitments are made with a catering hall.
