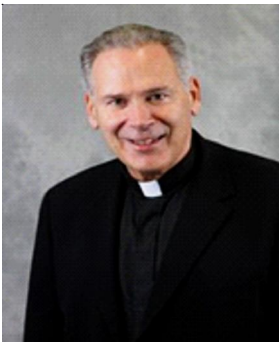

ST. KILIAN PRAY FOR US



JESUS AND TREASURE

"For where your treasure is, there will your heart be." In the Semitic world of ancient times, the heart is the core or center of the human person. Where is your center? Can we cry out like the psalmist: "Oh Lord, you are the center of my life."

"There was a rich man who had a good harvest. What shall I do? He asked himself. I have no place to store my harvest. I know! He said. I will pull down my grain bins and build larger ones. All my grain and my goods will go there. Then I will say to myself: you have blessings in reserve for years to come. Relax! Eat heartily, drink well. Enjoy yourself."

"But God said to him, you fool! This very night your life shall be required of you. To whom will all this piled up wealth of yours go?"

Although he never graduated college, Steve Jobs, the hugely successful billionaire, was asked to give the 2005 commencement speech at Stanford University. While he was preparing his address, Jobs knew he had cancer but still lived in hope of recovery. He told his audience *"Death is very likely the single best invention of life. It is life's change agent."* Jobs has been called a genius for his innovations in the technology industry. But his words at Stanford, reflect the wisdom of the ages.

From our earliest days, we are conscious of the fact that we are dying. The end of life puts every moment into perspective. This moment may very well be our last.

Jesus of Nazareth spoke most often about the kingdom of God that had arrived in him. This was a clarion call to conversion. Followers were to live in the kingdom as though they had found a treasure worth billions of dollars buried in a field. They were to be passionately involved in the work of justice, alleviating the wants and cares of others through compassionate concern and direct action.

Our financial resources, given by God, are to be used appropriately for God's glory; and the building of the

Kingdom of love, peace, and justice. The Lord warns us: *"You cannot serve both God and money."*

In an address at Stanford, Steve Jobs said that we shouldn't waste our lives living someone else's choices. In other words we need to listen to our own inner voice, what Catholics would call *the voice of conscience or the voice of God*, and have the courage to follow that voice no matter what the cost.

When Jobs was asked by Microsoft founder Bill Gates to give the majority of his wealth to philanthropy joining a number of other billionaire executives like Gates and Warren Buffett, Jobs declined. Although in his speech at Stanford he had said that death was life's change agent, he was not able to let go of some of his enormous wealth. He died, letting his family take over. His wife is overseeing his fortune. Money, power, and control can be dangerous addictions. Christ tells us: *"How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!"* (Mark 10) We can ask ourselves - *What do I own and what owns me?*

You and I have come to know the love of God revealed in Jesus Christ. He is our treasure, and growing rich in his sight is our primary concern. *"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."* (Luke 12) Every day is a gift. All we have is a gift that we are to give away. One day it will all be taken from us. In the meantime we are called to travel light, be generous with our time and money, and make God our greatest love. The Lord challenges us: *"For the measure with which you give, will be the measure that will be given back to you."* (Luke 6. 38)

As Christians stewards, we trust in God's generosity. We cultivate wisely that portion of the world that God has entrusted to us. We share our resources as love impels us.

These meetings are held on the **first and third Sunday of each month**. After attending the 9:30am Mass, parents should proceed to the Parish Center (below the church) for the Baptism Preparation Class. Godparents are welcome. Please call the rectory to arrange an interview with a deacon or priest to register for the preparation session and the Baptism ceremony. Reconciliation - Confessions are heard in the church on Mondays, 1:00-2:00 p.m.; Saturdays, 4:00-4:45 p.m.; and in the rectory by appointment. *Confessions are not heard on Mondays that are Holy Days or public holidays.* **Confessions in Spanish** by appointment. Please call the rectory at (516)249-0127.

Matrimony - Marriage arrangements should be made with a deacon or priest **at least six months** before the proposed wedding date. No dates for marriage will be given over the phone. *Note: The interview to schedule the marriage date at St. Kilian should be completed before commitments are made with a catering hall.* Additional information is available on the parish website: www.stkilian.com.

Anointing of the Sick - The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be received by any Catholic who is preparing for surgery, or is of advanced age, or is seriously ill. The sacrament is the Church's prayer for health and healing and should not be delayed until there is danger of death. Please call the rectory to speak with a priest. Also, to arrange for Communion to be brought to the homebound, please call the rectory to have a priest visit. After the priest visits, arrangements can be made for a Eucharistic Minister to regularly bring communion to the homebound.

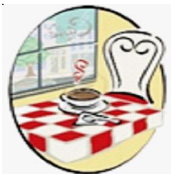

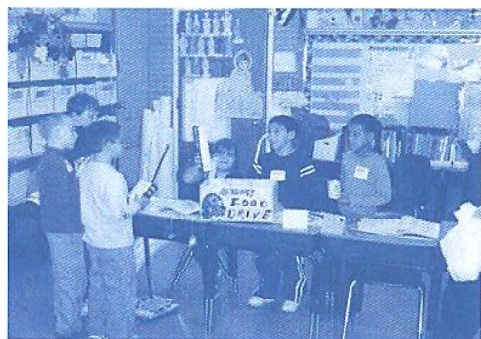
