# Christ is victorious! Death has been overcome! Alleluia!

loved one. What can one say to bring healing at the time of death and its aftermath? It is faith alone that can give meaning when we face death's finality.

We will all die some day. Death may come at a time we least expect. Suddenly, in the middle of the night, in an accident, or after a long lingering battle with disease, death will come. The masterwork of your life, the plans you have made and the dreams you have dreamed, will come to a halt. The artist's brush will be taken from your hand. Loved ones will grieve your passing and soon cold hard earth will cover your body. Generations will pass and you will be forgotten, a name on a tombstone.

Who will deliver me from this mortal body, doomed to die? St. Paul asks in Romans 8:24, and then gives his answer: "Thanks be to God, through Jesus Christ our Lord!

St. Luke, the author of the Acts of the Apostles, has Peter proclaim: "This man (Jesus Christ) God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead." (Acts of the Apostles 10. 40-41)

The greatest enemy of all, death, has been conquered. In the resurrection of Christ, we discover that we too shall be raised. This is our faith. We are indeed an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!

No one of his followers expected that Jesus of Nazareth, whom they had betrayed and abandoned, and witnessed as crucified by Pilate, would return from the dead. They had seen him bleed out and suffocate on the cross, his cold body taken down and placed in a tomb. All their hopes for him as the promised one, a prophet in the line of King David, had died with him.

But the unthinkable happened. Three days after his death he appeared to them and to hundreds of eyewitnesses. It was the same Jesus, but radically transformed. He forgave them; and then commissioned them to go forth and bear witness to the truth that God had come, and that God had shattered the darkness of sin and death.

We were no longer doomed to die. Death was simply a birthplace for joy; and life everlasting. All our hopes were validated and confirmed in the dazzling sacrament that we call the resurrection. The eyewitnesses rushed forth with joy and enthusiasm to tell the good news to the ends of the earth.

"Listen, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed." (1 Corinthians 15. 51-52)

Celebrate the Easter victory at Mass each week with your fellow Christians at St. Kilian! As our recently composed St. Kilian Vision Statement makes clear, the Eucharist and liturgy are essential to our life as believers. Around the table of the Lord, we recall the Lord Jesus and his life-giving death and resurrection. The Scriptures tell the love story, and we are challenged and inspired. We share together in the Body and Blood of Christ himself who is always there for us; and lives within us to carry on his saving work of peace, love and justice. We will live forever in the loving mercy of God.

Christ is risen! Glory fills you! Alleluia! Happy Easter!



## **Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord**



"But Peter got up and ran to the tomb." Peter was unique in this response to the news of Jesus' resurrection. The other apostles disregarded the reports from the

women who had seen the empty tomb and heard the angels because "their story seemed like nonsense and they did not believe them." But Peter took action. He got up and ran to see the evidence and "went home amazed at what had happened."

On this Easter day, we have a choice to make. We too have heard a remarkable report. We have been told that two thousand years ago, a man named Jesus defeated death and rose from the grave. To many people in today's world, this sounds like nonsense, just like it did when it first happened.

Some would like to dismiss the story entirely as a myth at best, or an outright lie at worst. Others try to spiritualize the miracle, suggesting that the Resurrection narrative is a story that is meant to symbolize the power of God, but whether or not Jesus actually rose from the dead is irrelevant. Finally, there are those who simply believe — those who, with Peter, make an act of faith and choose to take the Gospel literally.

This of course is the Christian way. It was not the Crucifixion that brought confidence to the early followers of Christ; it was the Resurrection. This momentous event has always made all the difference! We will only water down our faith if we reduce Easter to anything other than a true miracle. But to accept it as such will bolster our faith. As St. Paul wrote in the Epistle to the Romans, "Just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life." This Easter, may we experience the great joy of new life in the risen Christ.

#### Easter 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Christ,

This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad, Alleluia! Alleluia!

Saint Paul tells us that *In Christ Jesus you are a new creation!* Today we know with the mind of faith and feel in our hearts filled with joy how true that is and whence comes this wondrous and unique gift. It is Godøs gift that shows the boundless love He has for us when *in the fullness of time He sent His Son, born of a woman*. Without the obedient love of the Son who became one like us in all things but sin, we could never have been saved in the extraordinary way that in fact we are saved. We have been saved *by one like us*. That means that all we are and all that we experience on this earth has been embraced by Jesus, the God-Man. He alone could save us as Son of God. He alone, as fully human as we all are, could transform us, with whom He shares our humanity, by offering us the way to share in His divinity.

Nailed to the cross, He overcame that ancient curse of universal death. For His death became the passage way that destroys death and opens the path to eternal life for us and for all humankind. Now He breaks the bonds of death by breaking forth from the tomb in His glorified state. Now the angels can say to the first apostles, *Why look among the dead for one who is living? He is not here among the dead! He has risen as He said!* 

Nicodemus once asked Jesus *How can a person once grown old be born again? Surely he cannot reenter his mother's womb and be born again, can he?* No, Nicodemus, that is true. But Jesus has made the Holy Sepulchre His tomb to be the womb from which He comes forth to the glorified state that He shares with us. We who have entered into the font of Baptism and emerged from the waters of Baptism are His new creation sharing the life of the One Who today we truly proclaim Godøs Son, the Victor over sin and death, the Savior of all humankind.

As His new creation, Paul rightly calls us *Ambassadors of Christ*. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, on this Easter Day as we rejoice, I would like to call us all to re-commit ourselves to being *Ministers of Reconciliation in our families and our communities but especially in our Church and in our nation*. Too many members of our Church engage in polemic and seek to divide us as if bishops are persecutors of the laity or consecrated women and men are at odds with priests and pastors. These attitudes and these divisions deny the new creation the Risen Christ has given us. Our nation has sunk into a new low in public discourse when political leaders and pressure groups ridicule and label one another or accuse those who disagree with the prevailing forces as being õhatersö and õphobicö.

May all of us on Easter Sunday, in the presence of the Risen Christ, at Mass, in our homes and in our hearts, put aside those attitudes and commit ourselves to the ministry of reconciliation, eschewing the tawdry and the degrading, and re-affirming the respect and dignity of all, for **HE** came to be the Savior of all Humankind and today in our hearts and in our world, we proclaim

JESUS CHRIST IS RISEN AND HE IS LORD FOREVER AND EVER, AMEN!

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo Resucitado,
