Politics and Social Justice

“And at his (the rich man’s) gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man’s table...”

As Christians, we are not permitted to pile up great wealth when other people lack necessities. Catholic social teaching begins with the dignity of human persons. Everyone has been made in the image of God our Creator. Whenever we see human beings beaten-down by poverty or other deprivation, we are called by God to respond generously and to set people free from their oppression just as Jesus Christ did. We cannot remain silent when we see how government leaders and business people make decisions that are motivated by profit or self-gain; and oppress people denying their God-given human dignity.

When we vote, we do so based on whether we think our representatives are going to support and defend human life and advance human development, or not. Furthermore, we try to involve ourselves in the political system when we find that people’s rights and dignity are under attack or being abused. Justice is core to our mission as Christians. Consider joining our Justice & Peace Committee.

“Love your neighbor as yourself.” What decisions am I making that are truly respectful of the people in my life? What are my actions doing *for* people, and what are they doing *to* people? Are my words building people up, or tearing them down?

What are our prejudices? Do we look down on people who are homosexual, or addicted, or suffering mental illness? Are we prejudiced against persons of a different sex, perhaps disrespectful of men or women? Do we think of people of a different race as inferior? Do we stereotype people of other religions, perhaps as fanatics or violent in their disposition? We can

change our attitudes by the grace of God and the power of the Holy Spirit. We need to pray for purification of our minds and hearts, and then to act with justice.

Do we have our priorities in order both personally, and as a society? Where should we spend our money, and how generous are we called to be by Almighty God? For example, in his encyclical “On Social Concern” 1987, Pope John Paul II urged us all to consider redirecting resources from producing and selling armaments to alleviating the misery of impoverished peoples. In our country are we doing this? Will you vote for legislators who listen to the peacemakers blest by Jesus in the Beatitudes?

Are we truly promoting human dignity, safeguarding and protecting the rights of all especially the weakest (the unborn child) and the most vulnerable among us? In the 1960’s, President L.B. Johnson declared war on poverty. Do we hear any mention of the 45 million poor people in the U.S. in our present party platforms? Pope Francis, in his address to the U.S. Congress last fall, urged lawmakers to take action on climate change, ending the death penalty, creating a more just immigration policy for our nation and more. Are these issues mentioned in our presidential debates? Or by our congressional representatives?

Pope Francis spoke about the importance of legislative activity in our growth as a nation. *“You are called to defend and preserve the dignity of your fellow citizens in the tireless and demanding pursuit of the common good, for this is the chief aim of all politics.”* As the son of immigrants who came from Italy to Argentina, the Pope challenged Congress to open our borders to refugees. *“On this continent, too, thousands of persons are led to travel north in search of a better life for themselves and for their loved ones, in search of greater opportunities. Is this not what we want for our own children?”* Remember to research the candidates for office, and vote your conscience on Election Day.

In two weeks, my Pastor’s Page will address the results of parish leadership brainstorming on our Parish Vision Statement’s Fifth Pillar: *“Parish Social Ministry - We bring our faith to life by serving others through compassionate personal outreach, and commitment to social justice.”*

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

We are officially into our yearly renewal period to thank God for the gifts he has given us, and to think and pray about whether we can do more as a good steward. Many people review their financial budgets yearly and make adjustments as necessary. With the renewal of "Treasure" (our financial gifts) it is time to once again look at what we give to our parish and our community in the name of the Lord.

Our first weekend is called "Awareness Weekend". What does it mean to be aware? According to Webster's Dictionary aware means "*knowing that something (such as a situation, condition, or problem) exists; feeling, experiencing, or noticing something (such as a sound, sensation, or emotion); knowing and understanding a lot about what is happening in the world or around you*".

In our busy world it is difficult to take the time to really be **aware**, but here are a few suggestions (courtesy of our diocesan stewardship office) to help us to become more aware in our daily lives:

- Take time for regular prayer by choosing the best time of day for you to find quiet. We must shut off the outside noise in order to allow ourselves to listen to the voice of God.
- Notice and appreciate God working in the everyday. See the beauty in the first snowfall (a difficult challenge indeed!), the changing of the leaves going on now, and the budding of new life in spring.
- Truly acknowledge God as the Source of all we are and all we have. Give thanks to God!
- Give. We can joyfully give of our time, talents, intellect, energy, money and possessions for the benefit of others.

In the coming week you should be receiving a letter and a brochure regarding our upcoming "Take-A-Step" renewal. You may be tempted to toss it aside, even into the "circular file", but please try to take the 5 or 10 minutes to read through the letter and the brochure, and make yourself **aware**.

Sacraments

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the month at 2:00 p.m. in the church. Spanish Baptisms are celebrated on the 4th Sunday of the month at 2 p.m. Parents are required to participate in one Sacramental Preparation session. These meetings are held on the **first and third Sunday of each month**. After attending the 9:30am Mass, parents should proceed to the Social Ministry/Outreach Conference Room (across the parking lot) for the Baptism Preparation Class. Godparents are welcome. Please call the rectory to arrange an interview with a deacon or priest to register for the preparation session and the Baptism ceremony. Reconciliation - Confessions are heard in the church on Mondays, 1:00-1:30 p.m.; Saturdays, 4:00-4:45 p.m.; and in the rectory by appointment. *Confessions are not heard on Mondays that are Holy Days or public holidays.* **Confessions in Spanish** by appointment. Please call the rectory at (516)249-0127.

Matrimony - Marriage arrangements should be made with a deacon or priest **at least six months** before the proposed wedding date. No dates for marriage will be given over the phone. *Note: The interview to schedule the marriage date at St. Kilian should be completed before commitments are made with a catering hall.* Additional information is available on the parish website: www.stkilian.com.

Anointing of the Sick - The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be received by any Catholic who is preparing for surgery, or is of advanced age, or is seriously ill. The sacrament is the Church's prayer for health and healing and should not be delayed until there is danger of death. Please call the rectory to speak with a priest. Also, to arrange for Communion to be brought to the homebound, please call the rectory to have a priest visit. After the priest visits, arrangements can be made for a Eucharistic Minister to regularly bring communion to the homebound.

A SIMPLE GUIDE TO ONLINE DONATIONS FOR NEW USERS

HOW DO I LOG IN?

The Login button is located in the top-right corner of the site. If this is your first visit to the site, you will not log in until you have submitted your first transaction.

Once your first donation or payment has been submitted you will receive a log-in email, providing a temporary password that expires in 24 hours. Use the link in the email to **complete your user account** by establishing your secure password. Once completed, you will have access to all of your donation or payment information and can make changes at any time.

HOW DO I MAKE A RECURRING DONATION?

Making a donation or payment is extremely simple. First, click on an individual collection. There will be two options: Recurring Donation or Payment and One Time Donation or Payment. We will review both options.

1 To begin a recurring donation or payment, you will first choose an amount and then select the donation frequency from the options provided.






3 Now you will select the payment source for your donations. Choose the payment type from the options provided, then enter your payment information.

En el Evangelio de hoy escuchamos a dos hombres, un publicano y un fariseo que fueron al templo para hacer oración a Dios. El fariseo pensaba que Dios estaba muy orgulloso de él y de todo lo que hacía. El publicano en cambio pensaba que él no era digno de acercarse a Dios porque era pecador. Simplemente pedía misericordia. Sospecho que muchos de nosotros nos desconcertamos al oír esta parábola. Porque quizá pensamos como el fariseo y nos decimos a nosotros mismos: Yo me siento una persona muy buena, asisto a Misa los domingos, cumplo los mandamientos, doy mi colecta a mi parroquia, trato de convivir con mi vecino, etcétera. Sin embargo, Jesús nos indica que eso no es lo correcto. ¿Dónde está lo incorrecto del fariseo? Él olvidó un importante elemento de la vida espiritual: la humildad que nos lleva a la justificación ante Dios. Dios es el misericordioso el que nos salva.

Reconocer que somos pecadores como el publicano y descubrir el inmenso amor de Dios hacia nosotros es lo que las lecturas de hoy tratan de enseñarnos. *“La oración del humilde atraviesa las nubes, y mientras él no obtiene lo que pide, permanece sin descanso y no desiste”* (Eclo 35, 17). Es importante cumplir con nuestros deberes espirituales y sociales, no es malo cumplir los mandamientos y ser buenos, pero, hay que estar atentos al mensaje de Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy. Estar atentos en enfocarnos en la bondad de Dios. Reconocer que todos somos pecadores y que todos tenemos necesidad de la misericordia de Dios es una gracia. ¡Pidámonos esa gracia en esta Eucaristía!
