

THE MYSTERY OF THE TRINITY - A COMMUNITY OF PERSONS

When you and I were baptized we were immersed in the Trinity. We were consecrated from head to toe, just as the bread and wine are consecrated and become Christ. We too have become Christ through

holy Baptism. We became holy: priest, prophet, and king – God's beloved sons and daughters. "All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe everything that I have commanded you. And see, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

The Gospel of Matthew, quoted above, was written in the mid-80s A.D. A God who is one, and yet three persons, is already being proclaimed to the world. The apostles of Jesus, all Jews and monotheists have embraced a radically new understanding of the God of Israel. The dazzling experience that we call the resurrection was a conversion to a new insight into the mystery of God. The message they proclaimed of God sending his Son, his very self, was met with opposition in the synagogues for numerous reasons. Proclaiming the coming of a Messiah who had been raised from the dead, was not, to say the least, an expected event! Additionally, a Messiah who failed and had been crucified was contrary to Deuteronomy chapter 6- "Cursed is the one who dies on a cross." Finally, a Messiah who was, or made himself an equal to God, was blasphemy for devout Jews. Paul himself (before his encounter with the risen Lord on his way to Damascus) becomes a great prosecutor of the first Christians because of this.

The people of Israel believed in a strict and rigorous monotheism. This was the heart of their religious faith. There is one God. "I am the first and the last; besides me there is no God." (Isaiah 44:6) It is understandable that Christianity received a more welcome reception from the Gentile world than it did from the Jewish community.

Belief in one God who is perfect love; belief in one ultimate power as the force that brought

all things into existence, is something that the three monotheistic religions of the world profess: Jews, Muslims and Christians. All three religions believe in a personal God revealed in the Scriptures (the Torah and prophets and writings for Jews, the Koran for Muslims, the Old and New Testament for Christians).

Uniquely, we Christians proclaim a triune God. One God, but three distinct persons- a communion of persons. For Jews and Muslims this is totally unacceptable. They see Christianity as a kind of polytheism (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), and a threat to the true faith where there is only one God.

As Christians, we profess that Jesus is 'Lord'- that he is equal to God. Jewish texts from the early centuries, condemn this as heretical, because it creates two divine powers in heaven. The Koran also denies divinity to Jesus because there is only one God, Allah, and "it does not befit Allah to have partners." (The Koran)

A triune God is revolutionary. It took many centuries for Christians to formulate belief in a triune God. But it seems clear that from the earliest days, the proclamation of Jesus Christ as sent from God, and existing in the presence of God, was an essential element of the good news. "For though he was by nature God, he did not count equality with God something to be grasped, but emptied himself taking the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of human beings." (An early Christian hymn, Philippians 2 - 50AD)

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, be with all of you." (2 Corinthians 13:13-55AD)

"This Jesus God raised up, and of that all of us are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you both see and hear." (Acts 2:33 – 85AD) The truth is that we who have been baptized into the Trinity, the love-life of God, have been made divine! We remain sinners, but as Pope Francis likes to say, sinners upon whom the Lord has looked with love. Christ lives in each of us. We have been consecrated! With the gift of baptism goes the responsibility to proclaim the great news to the world.

<u>Memorial</u> Candles



Sacraments

Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the month at 2:00 p.m. in the church. Spanish Baptisms are celebrated on the 4th Sunday of the month at 2 p.m. Parents are required to participate in one Sacramental Preparation session. These meetings are held on the first and third Sunday of each month. After attending the 9:30am Mass, parents should proceed to the Social Ministry/Outreach Conference Room (across the parking lot) for the Baptism Preparation Class. Godparents are welcome. Please call the rectory to arrange an interview with a deacon or priest to register for the preparation session and the Baptism ceremony. Matrimony - Marriage arrangements should be made with a deacon or priest **at least six months** before the proposed wedding date. No dates for marriage will be given over the phone.



We converted to a new program named Parish Soft.qThis cloud based program has enabled the Parish to centralize all the Family Records in one place. Once there all you need to do is click on the ±My Own Churchqink and request a temporary password, you will receive that password in one to two days and then you can log onto the website, change your password and review your information. If there are any corrections that need to be made just follow the instructions and once completed the Parish Staff will ensure that the corrections are made.

Another benefit of using ±My Own Churchq is that you can track your donations to the Parish during the course of the year. We also hope to collect as many email addresses as possible so that we can begin to communicate with you through emails as well as other traditional means of communication.

SOCIAL MINISTRY/OUTREACH



Our Fiscal Year runs from Sept 1st through August 30th. At the end of our third quarter (May), we wanted you to know that through your generosity, we were able to provide a total of 12,246 services so far this fiscal year, to an average of 771 people per month. Some of these services include: food pantry and food stamp application assistance, case management, advocacy, clothing, employment counseling, friendly visiting, heating assistance and applications, transportation, and information and referrals to government and non-profit resources.

"FOR THE VISION STILL HAS ITS TIME, PRESSES ON TO FULFILLMENT,
AND WILL NOT DISAPPOINT." (The book of the prophet Habakkuk 2:3)

After two years of deliberations, the St. Kilian Steering Committee completed our parish Mission Statement and our Vision Statement. We have published these in holy card handouts, on our website, and in our parish bulletin weekly.

Last June 2016, parish leaders from our finance committee, Pastoral Council, stewardship committee, parish social ministry, Pastoral Team,, and other lay leaders met for brainstorming sessions to produce an Action Plan. We have been enacting this action plan as a parish family since last fall 2016.

What were the highlights of the Action Plan? 1. The Creation of a Welcome Wagon Ministry; 2. A Hospitality Ministry for monthly after Mass community building through mixing and mingling; 3. A 9:30 AM family oriented Mass with contemporary music to attract young families especially those in our faith formation program; and 4. Prayer and retreat opportunities both at St. Kilian parish and at nearby retreat centers.

This week, June 7, 2017, members of our Pastoral Council and Pastoral Team will meet to evaluate our progress in the accomplishment of the five pillars of our Vision Statement through action. What are those five pillars? Hospitality, the Eucharist and liturgy, lifelong faith formation, Stewarship and Parish Social Ministry (Outreach).

One year later, have we accomplished the goals of our Action Plan? Have we created a Welcome Wagon Ministry? Are we offering after Mass Hospitality monthly? Is the 9:30 AM Mass attracting younger families and leading them closer to God through prayer and music, the word of God and sharing in the Eucharist? Have we given our parishioners opportunities for prayer and retreat both on our campus at St. Kilian and at nearby retreat centers?

Next week, I will publish the results of the Pastoral Council and Pastoral Team discussion and evaluation that we will have tonight.

How do you think that we're doing as a parish community? Are you taking an active part in making our action plan reach its goals? If you would like to be more involved, let a member of our Pastoral Team or one of our parish deacons or priests know of your interest. If you are presently collaborating with us, thank you for your Spirit led ministry!

I feel like I can really peg a person one way or another after only meeting him or her a few times, but my wife and children continue to perplex me. Getting to know someone means you begin to uncover the layers of personality, feeling, and emotion that make up each human being. For those who see God as only a force or a light, God is simply defined. But for those who seek to be disciples of Jesus Christ, the God we find in relationship has many layers as well.

But that which we do know for certain about God comes to us primarily from the person of Jesus. He called us to a way of life by not only teaching us about how to live, but by showing us the example of his life. Our God is defined by generosity, sacrifice, compassion, and, of course, love. The more we incorporate these characteristics into our own life, the more we bear witness to the true nature of God. Then others can see a God that is a little less complex because they understand him through you and me. Our life will speak more than all the volumes written by all the theologians.

Good Morning/Evening Everyone,

My name is Lorraine Pieloch and I want to thank you for allowing me to take a few minutes of your time so that I can share my St. Kilian story with you. Moving to Farmingdale in 1966 I was anxious to find out about the

new parish we would be joining. The parish bulletin made me aware that there was a St. Kilians Mothers Club. At that time I was not yet a Mom but wanted to meet other women my age who lived in this community. I attended the monthly meetings and found the women to be friendly and encouraging. My husband Hank & I have been blessed with the ability to help St. Kilians with time, talent and some treasure. From time to time we review our financial giving to St. Kilians along with other charities outside our parish. We feel we are truly blessed and have a need to give back.

Presently I am still a Eucharistic Minister, a member of St. Kilian Womencs Guild and a teacher in our Faith Formation Program. I can honestly say that each ministry has contributed to my personal growth. Many times it meant stepping out of my comfort zone and sometimes pushing myself out the door when the thought of staying home seemed much more appealing.


