Addiction and Jesus Christ: Friend of Tax Collectors and Sinners

"The mourned were often young and white, and although how they died was never mentioned, nearly everyone knew or suspected the cause."

Opioid addiction has reached near epidemic levels on Long Island. Because of lack of education about addiction as a mental illness, and the biases and denial that accompany addiction, too many misunderstand the illness. Addiction is listed in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM) for healthcare professionals. It is not a moral problem. It is not a failure of will power, or the result of poor character formation in childhood. Addiction is a disease of the brain and as much a disease as physical illnesses like cancer, Alzheimer's disease, and heart disease. Society is largely ignorant of this I believe. Feelings of shame and failure too often result from lack of addiction education.

Addiction can be treated professionally through psychotherapy, behavior modification, twelve-step programs and/or medications administered under a psychiatrist' care. It is a disease of denial; and that denial extends not only to the addict, but to family members and society at large.

A few years ago, Rick Warren, founding pastor of a mega church in California, had endured the trauma of his son's losing struggle with depression and mental illness. Matthew Warren's death was ruled a suicide. His dad Rick, his wife and church congregation have dedicated themselves to a twofold response to this tragic death.

First, through educational efforts, striving to rid society of the stigma that mental illness is the result of some weakness in character. Bipolar disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder, chronic depression, schizophrenia, sociopathy, and the panoply of mental disorders are rooted in chemical imbalances, and treatable through a combination of psychiatric drug management and psychotherapy, both individual and group.

Second, Warren and his congregation are seeking funding to add significantly to the number of healthcare professionals and agencies nationally. As Christians, we are not on earth waiting to be lifted up into heaven. Like Jesus Christ, we address ourselves to all the issues that threaten, stigmatize and dehumanize human beings.

October is Respect Life month in the church. Poverty, racism, abortion, euthanasia, the death penalty, affordable housing, sexism, homophobia, gun control legislation, immigration, and much more, are part and parcel of the human rights issues that we are commanded to address. Our Outreach, Parish Social Ministry, the fifth pillar of our Vision Statement does this work, encompassing all the life issues.

We need to remember that the ministry of Jesus targeted the wounded and the oppressed. He went out of his way to engage people considered to be excommunicated. He embraced and healed the leprous and the untouchables in his society. He had prejudice toward no one. He made judgments about no one. It was only when people believed that they had no sin, when they arrogantly thought themselves to be better than others, that Jesus attacked them verbally.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven....For the measure with which you measure will be measured back to you." (Luke 6:37-38)





Time Talent & Treasure (Our Way of Life)



Note: Our thanks to parishioner Geoff Fenwick, who submitted the following in anticipation of our upcoming Stewardship Take-A-Step Renewal:

My name is Geoff Fenwick. My wife, Ann, and I moved from Brooklyn to Farmingdale in 1973, five years after I came out of the service.

I first heard about the Stewardship program around 2000, when our Pastor, Msgr. Swiger, called a meeting to introduce it to the Parish. I went to the meeting to complain about this new program as just another way to get us to donate more money to the Church. After Bob Cammarata, then the Diocesan Director for Stewardship, and the Msgr. described Stewardship and its real meaning, I left the meeting as a member of the newly formed St. Kilian Stewardship committee. I remained a member for about the next four years. When Fr. Bruce asked if I would join the newly reinstituted Stewardship committee, I said yes. Stewardship is not only about money, it is our sharing with others the gifts God gave us for nothing. Some of us, it may seem, got more gifts than others. Some may seem to be taller or stronger or are better athletes or better looking or are smarter or have more money than others, but everyone has something to offer. I am not tall and I never was a great athlete, but I can drive people to their doctor's appointments and physical therapy appointments in the Parish van. I certainly am not a public speaker, but I can help to stuff and mail envelopes to Parishioners or count the weekly collections. I am not rich, but I can volunteer at St. Francis Hospital and help a patient that needs a sympathetic word or directions or needs help ordering food to eat from the patient menu. We all have something to give.

I guess, because of my training as a civil engineer, I tend to think of things in a more practical nature. I see St. Kilian not only as my spiritual home and the place that supports my spiritual journey, I also look at the Church buildings and realize that I come to

Mass every week and sit in a place where the roof does not leak, is comfortably warm in the winter and cool in the summer. I sit in a pew and use a kneeler that is well maintained. Look above you and think of the work required just to replace a light bulb. The doors work well and the rest rooms are clean and well maintained. When I read the bulletin, I remember that it must be written, then printed, folded and delivered to us. Outside the snow is cleared from the parking lot and sidewalks for us. The grass and landscaping is always taken care of. I also think of the school. Even though it is technically closed, our children still go to their religion classes there. The auditorium is still used by the CYO and we have many Parish activities such as the annual Play, the õSpring Flingö, the St. Patrickø Day party and Masses at Christmas and Easter time. That building must be maintained. I also consider the Rectory which is where our Priests live, eat and have their offices. It also houses our Parish offices and St. Benedict Chapel. All of the Parish business is carried on there, the lighting and heating and air conditioning, the telephones, the computers and the associated paper and toner and repairs must be maintained. I also think about the Parish Outreach building, where so much food is distributed to the needy, where the Parish van is dispatched and where so many other acts of kindness are dispensed every day. That building also must be maintained. All of that costs money. Where does the money come from? It does not come from the government, nor does it fall out of the sky and certainly the Diocese does not provide it. The money has to come from us, the Parishioners. It is up to us, the Parishioners to support our physical church so it can be properly maintained and the spiritual programs that we want and need can be continued.

What you give is between you and God. I would just request that you prayerfully consider your contribution to the Church. But, remember, you are part of the St Kilian Parish family. We all, not just the rich, must support our Parish if it is to continue to be the great place it is and we want it to continue to be.

8 de octubre de 2017 27° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Ahora escuchamos la segunda de las tres parábolas que indicábamos el domingo pasado: los viñadores asesinos. La parábola es un buen ejemplo de ver cómo la violencia genera más violencia. Los labradores que alquilaron la viña pensaban que matar a los sirvientes del dueño era lo mejor, ya que al hacerlo tendrían más para ellos. En su bondad el dueño envío a su hijo, pero también a él lo asesinaron, pensando que al hacerlo heredarían la viña y todo el producto sería para ellos. Sin embargo, los arrendadores se quedaron sin nada.

Parece que en términos de violencia la sociedad no ha cambiado desde los tiempos de Jesús. Seguimos en la actualidad sufriendo de violencia en todos los ámbitos sociales. No hay respeto por la vida humana, mucho menos por la creación de Dios, dada a nosotros con todo su amor. Dios nos da misericordia y compasión, perdón y amor todos los días de nuestra vida. El reto para nosotros es dar frutos, es decir, para no equivocarnos siendo buenos padres de familia, excelentes hijos e hijas, buenos estudiantes y trabajadores incansables por el respeto y la paz. ¿Cómo lograrlo? ¿Qué hacer para tener un corazón que genere paz? San Pablo lo describe de la siguiente manera. Los cristianos pasan dificultades de toda clase. Solo en la intimidad, oración y acción encontrará la paz y la serenidad para dar frutos en abundancia. Ojalá que pongamos acción en esto para que nunca escuchemos las palabras de Jesús. "Les digo que les será quitado a ustedes el Reino de Dios y se le dará a un pueblo que produzca sus frutos" (Mt 21, 43).
