One of my brothers mentioned that he didn't know how much money to put in the Offertory basket at mass. I recommended a donation of one hour out of his workweek. This is a good start for a Christian steward - toward the goal of 5% of weekly income to the local parish, and 5% to other charities - the biblical ideal.

I have served in eight parishes on Long Island, and most average about \$10 per person in the collection basket. Sadly, not an hour's pay in the work week. At St. Kilian the same applies. We have on average 2000 people coming to mass, and a donation of \$10 per person or \$20,000 per week. This amount does not keep up with ever increasing and uncontrollable parish expenses.

It is a challenge to our faith that Catholics give the least amount of money to their church of all the organized religions: Jewish, Christian, and Muslim.

Your giving to St. Kilian fuels the mission of our parish. Without it, we cannot hand on the faith to our young people, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give drink to the thirsty, and welcome the stranger in parish outreach, or be effective in any of the other 50 ministries of our parish community. For example, in religious education alone we have three part-time directors, one full-time secretary and a part-time secretary. They serve 1300 children coming from 800 parish families. The salaries and healthcare benefits and retirement pensions for our religious education staff, amounts to nearly \$200,000. Heating, electric, and maintenance of the building and gym add another \$200,000.

Like everyone else on Long Island, parish expenses, like household expenses, increased more than 3% last year - as they do every year. How can we keep up with the demands of running this large parish with the same \$10 per person? The answer – we can't! We are currently running a low six figure deficit for this year. Total reserves are now \$650,000. An increase in your giving is critically important.

The median age of churchgoers in our parish of 5400 families keeps increasing. It is currently at 60 years of age. Older parishioners are retiring to other parts of the country, or returning to God. We celebrate 200 funerals per year at St. Kilian. Younger parishioners, registered within the last 10 years, are generally not coming to mass or contributing in the offertory in spite of our warm welcome and invitation. Over 200 new parishioner families register at St. Kilian each year. We celebrate 200 baptisms per year. Next month we will confirm 180 8th graders. Bishop Barres will be the confirming Bishop. Please pray that they

and their families continue to keep the Catholic faith alive through regular worship, ministry in the parish, and generous financial contributions.

The age of our buildings range from our school building (1963), our rectory/parish center (1985), our church (1997 - now 20 years old); to our newest Parish Social Ministry building (2010). All of these buildings need to be maintained, heated and air-conditioned, renovated, and modernized. This is not possible on \$10 average per week per churchgoer in the offertory!

At St. Kilian, over the past 60 years at least \$200,000 per year in the budget needed to be dedicated to ongoing maintenance and modernization of parish facilities. As our buildings have aged we are facing millions of dollars in needed repairs and renovation. I reported this in my Stewardship Annual report last fall 2016. Where will this money come from? *Every parish is on its own*. We receive nothing from the diocese or any other source. In fact along with all the other parishes on Long Island, about 25% of our offertory income leaves the parish to support the good works of our diocese - Catholic Charities, the Seminary, and Catholic schools especially.

Please consider your stewardship of treasure. As I advised my brother, how about donating one hour out of your workweek? If you're retired and receiving Social Security and a pension, strive toward 5% of your retirement income to St. Kilian. Begin by donating \$5 more per week in the collection this year. Then \$10 more next year - until you reach the 5% ideal? Do you trust God enough to be this generous?

The decision to give - whether it is of our precious time, or our precious money, is really a matter of placing God first in our life. In other words, not giving God what is left over at the end of the week.

I know you will be thinking and praying during our Stewardship renewal of treasure about how good God has been to you. "What return will I make to the Lord for all that he has given me?"

If you are giving sacrificially, thank you! If not yet, this is the time. Seize the opportunity. Don't wait any longer. Christ needs you. Give generously as the Lord has given to you!



To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Since my installation in January, I have had the joyful opportunity to visit many of the Diocese's parishes, schools and ministries. Thank you for your commitment to the pursuit of holiness and mission in every dimension of your lives. Thank you for your intimacy with Father, Son and Holy Spirit and your deep desire to share your Catholic faith on Long Island and to be instruments of *dramatic missionary growth*. Your commitment to the Catholic Church's Eucharistic Mission of Mercy to the World has inspired me at every turn.

As your Servant Successor of the Apostles and as your Shepherd, I am now asking all of us together to take a new and important step in the Church's Eucharistic Mission of Mercy by announcing that the Diocese of Rockville Centre will be making a major commitment to the ongoing healing of survivors of acts of child sexual abuse committed by clergy.

As you may have heard, I announced this past week the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for the Diocese of Rockville Centre. This program follows years of meaningful and ever vigilant steps taken in this Diocese to protect children and youth. It is a critical and tangible next step towards reconciliation, healing and compensation for survivors of acts of abuse committed by diocesan clergy.

Our Program will be administered by Mr. Kenneth Feinberg, a preeminent mediator in the country who has administered numerous high-profile compensation programs, including the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund and the Compensation Fund for the victims of the BP oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. Mr. Feinberg will be aided by his colleague, Ms. Camille Biros, in this effort.

The Diocese has also established an Independent Oversight Committee to oversee the implementation and administration of the Program. This committee consists of the Honorable A. Gail Prudenti, Dean of the Maurice A. Deane School of Law at Hofstra University and former Chief Administrative Judge of the Courts of New York State; Michael Cardello III, a partner with the law firm of Moritt Hock & Hamroff; and Dr. Thomas Demaria, a New York State Psychologist who is the Director of the Psychological Services Center of the Doctoral Psychology Program at Long Island University Post.

SE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE

The Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program builds on the reforms and best practices for protecting our children in the Catholic Church. The outreach of Bishops and survivors' assistance coordinators to survivors and their families, a firm zero tolerance policy and immediate reporting and cooperation with civil authorities, diocesan and parish audits, the ongoing training of clergy, employees and volunteers to prevent child abuse, extensive background checks on employees and volunteers, thorough screening of our seminarians preparing to be priests – these are examples of the proactive procedures which have been integrated into every dimension of the Catholic Church's life and will always require our moment by moment vigilance and commitment.

It is important to note that the funding for this program will come from investment returns over time and insurance programs. Of course, if we were not using these funds for this purpose they could have been used for other dimensions of the Church's mission. However, I am convinced that using these funds to help bring reconciliation, healing and compensation for survivors is a vitally important goal and commitment, and the critical next step in our Church's mission of mercy.

Pope Francis said that survivors of abuse and their families are "true heralds of hope and ministers of mercy". Each one of us in every parish in the Diocese of Rockville Centre and the universal Church is called to pray, to sacrifice and to be instruments of healing for those who have experienced sexual abuse or any form of abuse. In this spirit, we are instruments of the Holy Spirit and the Divine Mercy.

We stand in solidarity with our survivors and their families and we continue our commitment and vigilance to the protection of children in our Church and in society. God bless you all and thank you for the inspirational way you live our Church's Mission of Mercy each day.

Deadline for entries is Dec. 15, 2017.



15 de octubre de 2017 28° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

El evangelista Mateo nos muestra a Jesús desarrollando su ministerio en Jerusalén. La tensión entre Jesús y sus adversarios es muy notoria, hasta llegar a ser imposible. Su destino se cumplirá dentro de poco, la Pasión es inminente, ya está próxima. Las parábolas nos lo han mostrado estos tres domingos. Hoy, si notamos, la primera lectura del profeta Isaías va unida al Evangelio con referencia al banquete preparado para los invitados, la universalidad de la invitación es muy clara. Dios en el banquete desea crear amistad e intimidad con sus invitados. Por eso el profeta proclama: "El arrancará en este monte el velo que cubre el rostro de todos los pueblos, el paño que oscurece a todas las naciones" (Is 25, 7).

En la parábola de los invitados al banquete, Jesús tenía en su corazón todas estas imágenes de la bondad de su Padre y de lo que éstas significaban.
