"I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. He called for a divided nation to step back from the horrors of war; and to recognize the goodness of God our creator and his love for every human being regardless of their race, nationality or religion.

The importance of giving thanks in every circumstance has its origins in the Scriptures and our relationship with God. God loves us and will never cease loving us. How can we not be grateful for this undeserved and unmerited grace of God?

One of the hymns that I love to sing is "I say 'Yes, my Lord'"..."In all the good times and all the bad times I say 'Yes, my Lord'."


Only four months before he declared Thanksgiving Day as a national holiday, Lincoln had delivered his famous "Gettysburg Address". A believer in God, he was not a Christian. Not even the death and burial of his son, which he describes as the severest trial of his life, led him to embrace Jesus Christ. But in a letter to a friend he said "... When I went to Gettysburg and saw the graves of thousands of our soldiers, I then and there consecrated myself to Christ." This was a turning point in his life, a life that would soon be cut short in his assassination.

When the Pilgrims left Plymouth England on September 6, 1620, they were leaving a land of persecution hoping that they would finally find the religious freedom that they longed for in a new world. They found a harsh environment that made their survival perilous. Starvation and sickness took half their number in a harsh winter before the first spring came. They persisted in their determination and their prayers, supported by native Indians. The survivors came together in a shared meal to give thanks to God, and so our Thanksgiving had its origins.

We have much to be thankful for as Catholics. Our Eucharist, (the Greek word means thanksgiving), is our central prayer. We have come to know the love of God revealed to us in Jesus Christ. As AA reminds folks in recovery - how can we not have an 'attitude of gratitude' in all the good times and all the bad times?

Please Join Us for Ministry Hospitality Sunday

Today, November 19th, we have another ministry-hosted fellowship/hospitality following the 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses. Due to a conflict in the afternoon, there will be no hospitality after the 12:30pm Mass. We hope that you will stop downstairs in the Parish Center blue room to have a bagel, Danish, and breakfast beverage and spend time with fellow parishioners.

This monthos fellowship is being hosted by the following ministries and questions are welcome! A brief description of each ministry is provided.

Consolation - This is a care giving group of believing parishioners dedicated to the needs of the family and friends when they have suffered the death of a loved one. Consolation Ministry is one of the first hands to reach out and help others in our faith community during a difficult time. Assistance is given to the family in planning the funeral liturgy through readings, music and prayers. These ministers also attend the Funeral Mass and guide the family. The Consolation Ministry is under the direction of Deacon Francis Marino.

Bereavement ó The parish offers this Ministry to provide support groups for spouses, relatives, friends and children who have suffered the loss of a loved one. All facilitators are trained and accredited and have experienced the pain and suffering of the particular group. Six week spring and fall sessions are available and held in the lower level of the church. Individual counseling is also available. Deacon Frank Barone oversees the Bereavement Ministry.

Guardian Angel Perinatal Support Group (GAPS) ó This Ministry offers bereavement support for parents whose babies have died during pregnancy or in infancy ó miscarriage, stillbirth, premature birth or infant death (Including SIDS). This group offers understanding, friendship and bereavement support to help parents in knowing they are not alone in their grief when their baby has died. Meetings are currently held in the lower level of the church on the first Friday of the month from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. This group is led by parishioner Martha Weiss.

The following prayer groups will also be hosting:

Poor Souls in Purgatory – The mission of this group is to pray for our loved ones and all Holy Souls in Purgatory who are undergoing their purification from sin before they can share Godøs presence in Heaven. The group currently meets on Tuesdays at 6:00 p.m. ó 7:00 p.m. in St. Benedictøs Chapel. Parishioner Mary Thomas leads this group.

Bible Study ó This group reads Bible passages and then discusses what God is saying, how God shows His love for us, and what God wants us to do. Discussion of how we respond to Godø direction follows. Currently the group meets on Wednesdays (except in the summer) from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in the lower level of the church. Parishioner Kathy Schwantner is in charge of this group.

St. Kilian Prayer Group – This is an intercessory group, enjoying some of the Charismatic gifts and who sit before our Lord present in the Tabernacle. This group currently meets on Wednesday evenings from 8:00 ó 9:00 p.m. in St. Benedict Chapel and is also run by Kathy Schwantner.



19 de noviembre de 2017 33^{er} Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Estamos terminando año litúrgico. Los preparativos durante este mes nos recuerdan que nos acercamos al final de este año. La vida pasa rápido, sin darnos cuenta de que avanzamos al final. La parábola de hoy coincide con la venida del Señor, y toma tiempo. Sin embargo, su llegada tomará a muchos por sorpresa. El relato del Evangelio nos invita a trabajar los talentos mientras llega el dueño. La parábola tiene tres momentos. El dueño se ausenta de la casa y encomiendo a varios de sus servidores sus bienes de acuerdo a sus capacidades. En su ausencia, unos trabajan afanosamente, y duplican la cantidad. Pero uno de ellos se limita a conservar lo encomendado sin el más mínimo esfuerzo.

¿Con cuál servidor se identifica usted? ¿Esconde los dones que Dios le da por pereza? ¿Qué impide que sea fiel al Señor? Estamos de nuevo llamados a la vigilancia y a la espera, como las vírgenes prudentes del domingo pasado. El punto clave de estas dos parábolas es ¿qué se hace mientras se espera? No se trata solo de vigilar, sino también de fructificar, es decir, de luchar por una sociedad más justa.
