"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End." (Revelation 1.8)

Just before my fifth anniversary as a priest, my parents traveled to Italy, visiting Rome, the Vatican, Florence, Venice and Assisi. In Florence they purchased a ring to celebrate my anniversary. They had it inscribed with the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet: Alpha and Omega. For Christians, Christ is the beginning – the Alpha; and the end – the

Omega; of all human history.

The word Advent, (Adventus in Latin), is the Latin equivalent of the Greek word "<u>Parousia</u>" (meaning the Second Coming of the Lord). The season of Advent is both a beginning, and an end of the church's liturgical year of grace.

History is not exact about when this season of longing (in anticipation of Christ's return in glory, and of the birth of the Messiah) began. St. Perpetuus, a fifth century Bishop in France, decreed a fast three times a week, beginning on the feast of St. Martin, November 11, until Christmas day. The Second Council of Tours (567 AD in France) commanded monks to fast from the beginning of December until Christmas. Soon this penance was extended to the laity, and called St. Martin's Lent- a 45 day season. Eventually the practice of doing penance during Advent spread from France to England.

At its heart, the season of Advent is one of anticipation. Anticipation of the Lord's coming in glory to bring us the fullness of joy and of love in the kingdom, and anticipation of the celebration of the birth of Christ, are joined together. We are waiting for the breaking in of eternity. We are waiting and longing for the end of time both in history, and our personal lives.

"Beloved, now is the acceptable time spoken of by the Spirit, the day of salvation, peace and reconciliation: the great season of Advent. This is the time eagerly awaited by the patriarchs and prophets, the time that holy Simeon rejoiced to see." (St. Charles Borromeo, 16th century)

Christmas shopping to the contrary, *Advent is a time of reflection and of quieting down*. Advent will be fruitful and rewarding as Christmas dawns, when we let go of all our conceit and pretenses. This year Father Michael Sullivan, OSA, will lead us in an Advent Retreat to begin the season.

The Advent Scriptures bring powerful prophets to our reflection. Isaiah, prophesying seven centuries before Christ, offers a hope-filled cry for God's salvation that will come in the future. "They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again."

We long for the coming of the day of the Lord, when the weapons of violence will be beaten into agricultural tools of cultivation - producing a rich harvest of love, peace and justice. The day of the Lord when all our longings will be fulfilled, and glory will fill us.

Jesus urges us as his disciples to always be prepared for the breaking in of God in our lives. The fullness of God's work remains in God's hands, but the Spirit is moving us to readiness; using all our strength to build a better world now. "So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." (Matthew 24. 44)

St. Paul, reflecting the early Christian expectation of Christ's return, urges us to cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. As in the symbolism of our white baptismal garment, we must put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

John the Baptist appears at the bank of the Jordan River, calling Israel and us to readiness and repentance: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" Will we be found watchful and ready when the Lord returns? Our hearts are restless, until they rest in Him.



Following are excerpts from letters prepared by these young people, and submitted to the pastor, Fr. Bruce, requesting the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Going to Mass and praying is important to me because I know that even in the hardest of times, the church will always be there.



I would like to be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit and renew my Baptismal promises.

This year I have learned the importance of family and community, and that it is important to make unselfish choices and help others. I also learned it is important to discard negative attitudes.

I am ready to give back to my parish and community.

I learned that Jesus' way of living was to always be loyal and kind. I also learned that if I ever don't know what to do or think, what would Jesus do?

I aslo want to receive Confirmation to be a role model in the Church and possibly be a sponsor one day.

My mother is very devoted to her faith and has always been a part of Christian service, including teaching religion for seven years.

I plan to be a good example of Christ's love.

Before I started preparing for Confirmation, I really didn't understand the meaning behind the sacrament. I learned that I will receive the special gift of the Holy Spirit.

The projects I have completed during this year have been about how to better myself as a person and a Catholic, and how to help people in need. This has made me stop and think not only of myself, but of others.

I am really looking forward to making Confirmation this year. My whole family made it and I'm going to follow in their footsteps.

The following Stewardship Witness Talk is being published with Pat Hartenstine's permission. Thank you, Pat, for your willingness to share your story during our recent Take-A-Step renewal.

Good morning my name is Patricia Hartenstine but most of you know me as Pat. I have been a member of St. Kilian community for approximately 25 years. I was raised Catholic and went to church every Sunday, but that was the extent of my church participation in my youth. I left the church for 12 years when I first got married. When my son was born I started to feel a call back to the Church. It took me a couple of years to take the first step but when I came back I wanted more than just a Sunday relationship with God.

It was about the same time that I decided that I needed and wanted to bring my son up Catholic too. I was extremely lucky when I called the rectory to speak to someone. Deacon Frank Barone was on call and he made me feel very welcome. He spoke to my husband and me and scheduled the baptism. My son was baptized in St Benedicts Chapel a month before his 4th birthday and started LaSalle Regional School here at St. Kilian the following year.

About 2 years later, Deacon Frank said to me that it was time to give back to the parish. Not knowing what I could do, he suggested I join the baptism ministry and I am still a member of this ministry to this day.

I continued to be open to the Holy Spirits direction to help the parish but had a hard time identifying my gifts and talents. In about 1998, I felt a calling to become a Eucharistic minister. I went to the diocesan training followed by the training in the parish and am still serving the community today. The feeling I get when I serve you communion comes from the heart, I feel Jesus deep within.

I tried volunteering for other ministries but never felt a connection. I didn't know how to get further involved and just continued in these 2 ministries for years.

When Deacon Francis became the Spiritual leader of the Eucharistic ministers I started to help him with scheduling, training and communications of the ministers within the parish. This ministry has helped me know many of you and for you to know me. I'm blessed by the people Jesus has put in my life and the ways He has directed my faith journey.

I went through a 2 year diocesan program called the Pastoral Formation Institute. I learned a lot about myself in the Church and the teaching of the

church. It helped me see that I had more to give back to the community.

Today I am a member of the Liturgy committee and the Spirituality committee along with being a Eucharistic minister, a Lector and still a member of the baptism ministry. God has given me many gifts that I want to give back to the community.

I have learned that my work in the parish is a major part of my relationship with God. It keeps me connected to the community and more importantly the people who need assistance.

I regularly and prayerfully examine my financial donations to the parish and other charities. When I retired from my job about 2 years ago I thought I would need to reduce my parish financial support. Making my donations important and giving to God first, my weekly donations and my yearly pledge to the Catholic Ministries Appeal have remained constant. Also, by signing up for the parish on line giving, I'm automatically able to keep my weekly donation steady.

I know that my donations support many parts of the St Kilian community. Our outreach program is a huge help to our surrounding community and requires financial support and food donations from the parish. Our Parish buildings and grounds need to be maintained, modernized, and repaired. What we are able to put in the basket is just part of what we can do for our community.

I have been extremely blessed that God has put people in my life to show me the way. Sometimes it is not obvious who they are. The important part is listening to what God wants for you. We need Jesus and the Holy Spirit to help us find the way we are meant to go.

Stewardship is an ongoing journey that we travel to help and aid the people of the community. With Jesus in front, leading the way and opening doors you can do many wonderful things. My life has been enriched by Jesus showing me the way, putting people in my path and continuing to open new doors for me. The rewards are many. Consider what you can do and expect the blessings to come back abundantly.

IMPORTANT BUT VIRTUALLY UNKNOWN FACTS

In 1973, the Supreme Court Doe vs.Bolton decision became the companion case to Roe vs. Wade, making abortion legal throughout the entire pregnancy. Bolton case is based on deceit and fraud. I stand today in this place of healing, the National Memorial for the Unborn, and pledge to the memory of these innocent children, that as long as I have breath, I will strive to see abortion ended in America.ö

Norma McCorvey,the Roe in the **Roe v Wade** decision, never sought or had an abortion. She later became an avid national prolife leader. Both of these women were innocently used as they simply sought help, not abortion. Matrimony - Marriage arrangements should be made with a deacon or priest **at least six months** before the proposed wedding date. 26 de noviembre de 2017 Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo

La solemnidad de Cristo Rey nos ayuda a reflexionar en lo que pretendemos como comunidad de creyentes a lo largo del año. Ver el valor que damos a Jesucristo y el hecho de ser miembros de su Reino. Cerramos el año proclamando a Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. El Papa Pío XI instituyó esta fiesta al finalizar el año santo en 1925. Pero el mismo Señor Jesús, a la pregunta de Pilato de si él era en verdad el rey, contesto: "Tú lo has dicho. Soy reyö (Jn 18, 37). Mateo termina su año y durante éste, nos mostró lo fundamental del Reino. Escuchamos a Juan Bautista al principio del Evangelio. "Arrepiéntanse, porque el Reino de los cielos está cerca" (Mt 3, 2).

El Papa Francisco, en su homilía de noviembre 23 de 2014 dijo. õLas lecturas que hemos escuchado nos muestran cómo realizó Jesús su reino; cómo lo realiza en el devenir de la historia; y qué nos pide a nosotros.

õAnte todo, *cómo realizó Jesús su reino*: lo hizo con la cercanía y ternura hacia nosotros. Él es el pastor, de quien habló el profeta Ezequiel en la primera lectura (cfr. 34, 11-12. 15-17). Todo este pasaje está entrelazado por verbos que indican la premura y el amor del pastor hacia su rebaño: buscar, cuidar, reunir a los dispersos, conducir al apacentamiento, hacer descansar, buscar a la oveja perdida, recoger a la descarriada, vendar a la herida, fortalecer a la enferma, atender, apacentar. Todas estas actitudes se hicieron realidad en Jesucristo: Él es verdaderamente el «gran pastor de las ovejas y guardián de nuestras almas» (cfr. Hb 13, 20; 1 Pe 2, 25)ö. ¡Viva Cristo Rey!
