

"A SAVIOR HAS BEEN BORN FOR YOU WHO IS CHRIST AND LORD."

Since the 13th century AD, the Christmas crèche has played a prominent role in educating Catholic Christians about the story of Christmas. In 1223, when the printing press had yet to be invented and the people of God were

overwhelmingly illiterate, St. Francis of Assisi, inspired by the spirit of creativity produced the first Christmas pageant with actors playing the parts of the baby Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, Angels and Magi. The impact of the Christmas crèche and its powerful illustration of the events surrounding the birth of Jesus Christ, has influenced the Catholic imagination for centuries.

The crèche scene is present in almost every Catholic home in late Advent and throughout the Christmas season. It is a marvelous teaching tool that has deeply affected our contemplation on the mystery of God become human. What Catholic child has not been told about the baby Jesus in the crib and his mother Mary?

"Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." Like the Angels who worshiped at the first crèche, Christmas carols lift our hearts and minds in adoration and praise, of the God whose love impels him to become weak on our behalf; as fragile as a little child.

I am deeply grateful for the many ways in which you make Christ present in our parish community. Because of your faith in God who is with us, our liturgies are uplifting, our outreach to the poor is outstanding, and our effort to teach the good news to our children and adults is transformative.

During the past two years, the St. Kilian Steering Committee developed our parish Vision and Mission statement, published regularly in our bulletin and on our website. We have been facing the challenge of parish buildings that are in great need of repair, and only \$650,000 in reserves. I started a collaborative process to address these concerns. I have held three meetings with parish leadership: 50 people from our Finance Committee, Pastoral Council, Stewardship Committee, CYO,

Family Life Committee, Liturgy Committee and Building and Grounds Committee. Together we brainstormed on the pros and cons of various options to address limited reserves, and parish buildings needing repair. We heard from an architect-engineering firm on possible options. A 12 member subcommittee was formed and has met a number of times. They will invite you to an Open Meeting early in the New Year on a date to be determined, for Q and A. Keep praying to the Holy Spirit for guidance as we grapple with important issues to help us consolidate our parish resources for a strong and vibrant future. Your constructive input is welcomed.

May you discover the love of Christ once again in our Christmas masses and in your family gatherings for these holy days of the Christmas Season through the Baptism of the Lord on January 8, 2018.

Merry Christmas to all! And prayers for a happy, healthy New Year 2018!



Christmas 2017

Merry Christmas to you and your families! As we celebrate the Prince of Peace's entrance into world history, we give thanks to Father, Son and Holy Spirit for the Mission of Mercy of our Holy Catholic Church.

We give thanks for our families, our domestic churches, which transform the world and history with Christ's Love and the Church's missionary spirit

This past month we dedicated the Gianna Center of Long Island for Women's Health and Fertility, which in its mission unites the Splendor of Truth of Catholic Moral Teaching on Marriage and the Family with ethical reproductive science through the use of *NaPro Technology* and the *Creighton Model Fertility Care System*.

This was an important moment for the Catholic Church and Catholic Health Services in its service to the common good of Long Island.

The dedication of the Gianna Center gives a living expression of celebration to some important 2018 Church anniversaries.

On July 28, 2018, we will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of Blessed Pope Paul VI's 1968 encyclical *Humanae Vitae*. Blessed Paul VI was prophetic as he courageously taught that all marital intimacy celebrates both the love-giving and life-giving dimensions of married love that cannot be separated.

The Holy Father predicted accurately the dire consequences for society of separating the lovegiving and life-giving dimensions of married love. He was widely criticized, even ridiculed at the time, but as we know from the Old Testament that is exactly what happens to prophets who stand up for liberating truths.

Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman once said: "The Catholic Church is not behind the times. It is beyond the times." And as the renowned particle physicist Professor Stephen Barr emphasizes, in the history of the world, the Catholic Church is the greatest friend and supporter of *ethical* scientific development. The Gianna Center is an expression of this friendship, support and partnership in history.

On August 4, 2018, we will also celebrate the 25th Anniversary of St. John Paul II's great encyclical *The Splendor of Truth*, which shows that moral choices and decisions that are grounded in objective truth transform and illumine the lives of individuals and society.

The Gianna Center is a powerful part of that dedication to truth, charity and mercy and during this Christmas 2017, we ask the Christ Child to lead all those involved in the mission of the Gianna Center and all who are served by that mission.

The Center's patroness, St. Gianna Beretta Molla (1922-1962) was a wife, a mother and a physician dedicated to the progress of medical science. Her image is prominent at the main altar of St. Agnes Cathedral where I will celebrate Christmas Midnight Mass.

I will pray that her intercession and her courageous and holy example may inspire each one of us and our family members this Christmas season and be yet another catalyst of *dramatic missionary growth* on Long Island.




