

# THE VIRGIN MARY -"LET IT BE DONE TO ME ACCORDING TO YOUR WORD"

Every week at Sunday Mass we recite the fifth century Creed from the early ecumenical councils of the church. This is because the doctrines professed in the creed are of the highest importance for Catholic Christians. There is one God but three divine persons, we proclaim. God the Son, the

second person of the Trinity, was born of the Virgin Mary. Mary is in this sense, the Mother of God; the God-man Jesus Christ. We are aware that Mary is of the highest importance, not for herself, but because of her role in the history of our salvation as a human race. "Let it be done to me according to your word" she tells the angel messenger of God- freely giving herself over to God's plan, and ready to face any consequences for herself (unwed mother, accusations of infidelity to Joseph). The honor she receives comes from her bearing God in her womb. Our Catholic faith is Christ – centered.

The mother of Jesus of Nazareth is a woman "wrapped in silence." In other words, there is little reference to her in God's public revelation, the New Testament (Mary speaks only in the Infancy Narratives of Luke and Matthew, and at Cana in John's Gospel). She is "...consistently a symbolic character, while Jesus is a historical character." (Raymond Brown, SS) Over the centuries Mary acquired a great outpouring of devotion because of her motherhood, and her faithful following of her Son, the Savior of the world - to the cross and beyond. She became for Christians, a feminine symbol of God.

In the Christian imagination and spirituality, masculine attributes for God; all- powerful and omnipotent, were complemented by feminine attributes found in the Virgin Mother. Reflect for a moment on Michelangelo's Pieta - Mary filled with immense sorrow and tenderness holds the body of her dead son in her arms; and offers him to us. The mother who gave him life and nursed him at her breast, with the utmost tenderness, hands him over to the church. For many Christians, Almighty God seemed too awesome to approach. Mary, in her motherly way, was not intimidating.

Through the centuries that followed, Mary was revered by the church as an example par excellence of virtue and piety. "In the Middle Ages Mary became the champion of the Knights, "Our Lady", and the symbol of chaste love. In the Renaissance she became the tender mother caring for her spiritual children. In this century she was exalted as part of the Holy Family, that model family of Nazareth which was the Church's rebuttal to divorce and lax morals. And most recently she has been hailed by the American bishops as the model of the liberated woman." (Raymond Brown, S.S: *Crises Facing the Church*). Mary is the Queen of the Americas, honored not only because of her submission to God's will, but also because she has become the *champion of justice* for the poor and for indigenous people under the title of 'Our Lady of Guadalupe'.

For women especially, Mary has become in recent decades, a model and advocate for women's dignity, gender equality, and the overturning of sexist attitudes. Mary, Queen of the Apostles, pray for us.





And so the prayers continue, as does our peaceful hour before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The numbers have dwindled seriously...many having already gone home to God. Jesus would love to see you there. So would we!

We treasure that personal time with Him each week and welcome all who would like to join us.
