A SLUR THAT CUTS DEEP

He's a loser! You're a loser! Among all the hurtful slurs we mindlessly utter this particular one is perhaps the most hurtful and damaging. It needs to be forbidden in our public discourse and stricken from our vocabulary.

We we come a long ways today in forbidding certain language in our public discourse. Mostly the terms that we outlaw have to do with pejorative phrases that refer to someone race, gender, or disability. Categorically forbidding them in our language was long overdue and may not be dismissed as simple political correctness. It a matter of correctness, plain and simple, of justice, of charity, of fundamental human decency. Language is an economy that also often unjust. It unfairly affirms some and unduly slanders others. We need to be careful with it. Language can deeply scar others, even as it keeps us unconsciously locked inside negative stereotypes that leave our minds and our hearts colored by racism, bigotry, and misogyny.

But racial, gender, and disability slurs are not the only slurs that cut, wound, and scar others. Terrible as they are, those insulted by them have the consolation of knowing that the insult is aimed at millions (or, in the case of gender, billions) of others. There consolation in numbers! Being shamed along with millions or billions of others still hurts, but you re in good company.

There are slurs however, insults, that are more brutally singular and more cruelly personal, which aim to shame ones particularly private inadequacies. With such a slur yous no longer in good company, yous now unanimity-minus-one. The term olosero is such a slur. It aims to shame a person in a very singular, hurtful way. When yous called a olosero, yous not being singled out and shamed because you belong to a certain set, a race, a gender, or a class of people. Yous being shamed because you of you alone, singularly, personally of are judged as not measuring up, as not worthy of respect, and as not worthy of full acceptance. Yous judged as inferior with an inferiority that cannot be blamed on anyone except yourself. Yous deemed a loser! And yous alone in that!

This kind of shaming isnot new. It has ever been thus. Certain people have always been shunned, shamed, and ostracized. We have this curious human flaw that, unless ito addressed, has us believe that for us to be happy it isnot enough that we be accepted, someone else has to be excluded.

In biblical times, people who had leprosy were ostracized from society, condemned to live in regions outside of normal life, and cry out õuncleanö whenever anyone approached them. But they had legitimate reasons for putting these persons outside the circle of normal life. Leprosy held the danger of contagion. Today, without any kind of legitimacy, we're still designating certain people as õlepersö, as unfit to flourish inside the circles of normal life. We classify them as õlosersö and condemn them to the fringes. They're the new lepers.

Examples of this abound, but perhaps we see this most simplistically played out in our high schools where there is always a crowd that popular, an õinö crowd who dictates the ethos, decides what acceptable, and

holds down the center of the community, even as they dong constitute its majority. The majority of students are outside that more-exclusive inner circle of popularity, on the edges of it, trying for full acceptance, not fully õinö and not fully õoutö. But there always still another set, the ones seen as õlosersö, as not measuring up, as not being worthy of full status and recognition. This group is not given permission to fully belong. Every human circle has that category of persons.


There are a myriad of complex reasons, many to do with mental health, which can help explain why, sometimes, tragically, a high school boy will take up a gun, come into his school, and shoot his classmates. But it hard not to notice that, almost always, it is a young man who has been deemed a olonero, a loser. We can blame his immediate peers and his classmates for deeming him such, however consciously or unconsciously this is done. His classmates are victims, not just of this young man lilness and rage, but also of a society that blindly helps produce this kind of illness and rage.

Iøm not a parent, but if I were, I would try with all the moral powers that I possessed as a parent to have my children purge their vocabulary of racial, gender, and disability slurs. But I would, too, use every moral and persuasive power I had to have them purge their vocabulary of pejorative words that shame someone else in his or her singularity. The word õloserö would be forbidden in the house.

Both society and the church are houses. We have, thank goodness, in recent decades forbidden the use of words that disparage another person on the basis of his or her race, gender, or disability. It is time we forbid some other slurs inside the house!



New Pastoral Letter Commemorates Fiftieth Anniversary of Humane Vitae

Fifty years ago, on July 25, 1968, Pope Paul VI issued an Encyclical Letter entitled *Humanae Vitae*, õOn Human Lifeö. On October 14, 2018, Pope Francis will canonize his predecessor as Pope Saint Paul VI.



In this anniversary year, Bishop John O. Barres of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has issued a Pastoral Letter entitled *The Supreme Gift: The Gift of Life*, commemorating the encyclical of this soon-to-be-canonized saint. This teaching of the late Holy Father is in many ways more important today than at any time before.

In his letter, Bishop Barres wants to teach the people of the diocese the important truths of *Humanae Vitae*, because these truths very much need to be reexamined today in light of the problems we face in our time.

Please take a copy of *The Supreme Gift* home, read it, and discuss it as married couples and as families. Bishop Barres says: õUnderstanding the teaching of *Humanae Vitae*, believing it, and living it, is one of the first and most important answers to the crisis of our time. I truly believe that the future Pope Saint Paul VI wrote the letter more for our times than even for his own. Today, it can become the first step in repairing the injury between men and women, husbands and wives, parents and children, the family and society.ö

At the Mass of Beatification of Pope Paul VI in 2014, Pope Francis said of his predecessor:

õWhen we look to this great Pope, this courageous Christian, this tireless apostle, we cannot but say in the sight of God a word as simple as it is heartfelt and important: thanks! Thank you, our dear and beloved Pope Paul VI! Thank you for your humble and prophetic witness of love for Christ and his Church! í In [his] humility the grandeur of Blessed Paul VI shines forth: before the advent of a secularized and hostile society, he could hold fast, with farsightedness and wisdom ó and at times alone ó to the helm of the barque of Peter, while never losing his joy and his trust in the Lord.ö



MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO - ALENTAR ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA (Gospel Meditation)

29 de julio de 2018 17º Domingo del tiempo ordinario La lectura de Reyes y el Evangelio están entrelazadas por el misterioso milagro de multiplicación del pan, de lo poco a lo mucho. Humanamente, en el episodio de la multiplicación, el sirviente de Eliseo y Felipe no calcularon lo que necesitarían para saciar el hambre de la multitud. Sin embargo, la misericordia de Dios, como siempre, se excede en abundancia al dar crédito a la falta de cálculo de los encargados de repartir el pan. En el libro de Reyes, Eliseo, con veinte panes, logra saciar el hambre de cien personas. Eliseo le dice a su sirviente: õDáselos y que coman, porque esto dice Yavé: comerán y sobrará. Les sirvieron, comieron y les sobró, tal como lo había dicho Yavéö (2 Re. 4:43-44). En el Evangelio, Jesús, con cinco panes y dos pescados solamente, da de comer a unas cinco mil personas, y recogieron doce canastos llenos con los pedazos que no se habían comido (Jn. 6:12-13). Nadie puede estar preparado para la superabundancia de los regalos de Dios por medio de Jesús. En nuestra experiencia, tener abundancia de bienes y riqueza usualmente es un signo de trabajar mucho o heredar bienes. En las lecturas de este domingo, la abundancia es señal segura de los dones que recibimos de Dios. Para los discípulos de Jesús, que somos todos los bautizados, la grandeza de parte de Dios por medio de su Hijo Jesús es la Eucaristía que vivimos cada domingo. En la vida, existen otras abundancias de las que se debe agradecer. La familia y los amigos que disfrutamos alrededor de nosotros. ¿Hemos calculado estas maravillas?
