

IMAGES OF GOD

I have a public confession to make. I was caught by a traffic camera making a right turn from Conklin Street onto Route 110, without making a complete stop before merging into traffic. I broke the law. For some folks, God is like that. Far away, at a distance, distant and disengaged and ready to trap us in sin. Pathetically eager to catch us

misbehaving and ready to penalize us.

The Second Vatican Council defined conscience as "the secret core and sanctuary of a man (sic). There he is alone with God whose voice echoes in his depths." To obey the conscience is the very dignity of a human being. The conscience urges us to do this and to avoid that. We will be judged by our conscience decisions, because the conscience is the supreme authority. The conscience is formed by our parents, church teaching, and it matures through prayer and the Scriptures, and our deepening personal relationship with Jesus Christ. When we are attentive to the true voice of God within us, we grow in holiness.

The parental influence, experienced during our early formative years in the home, and learned from our parents and other significant family members, has a lasting effect on our understanding of God. That parental voice can easily be confused with the voice of God. Who among us in childhood has not thought that our dad, or mom, was God!

Our parents are not God however. They are secondhand reflections of God. Our Christian maturing can only happen in prayerful reflection on the word of God in the Bible, as God speaks to us in the depths of our being in prayer. We have to work at recognizing false images that have been handed down to us that lead us to a certain amount of self-hate and rejection. A scrupulous, overly strict conscience can result. What is truly the voice of God, and what is the voice of mom or dad?

None of our parents were perfect. As a consequence, our understanding of God and the ways of God is imperfect. No one's home life is completely functional and healthy. In varying degrees all of our homes were dysfunctional. The God that we meet in our homes is not always an accurate image of God. We must hold up our experience against the light and life of the Scriptures, and our deepening friendship with Jesus.

Some of us may have a difficulty in trusting God because our dad broke his promises often. Some of us may make extreme demands on ourselves and be our own worst critic, because that is what we experienced from our perfectionistic parents. Some of us may believe that God is distant and uninvolved because our own dad or mom was that way. We may think of God as demanding or displeased with us, because

we've confused our parents' demands and emotional displeasure with our image of God.

There are many false images that we likely acquired in our developmental years. The truth is that God, the creator of the universe, for no reason that makes sense, finds us wonderfully attractive. God has entered into a covenant with us as the Bible witness relates. That covenant begun with Abraham and renewed with Isaac and Jacob and Moses, has reached an apex in Jesus Christ.

Covenant is an ancient concept that is far more than an agreement. It is a permanent commitment between unequals: God and the human race. No matter how far we fall away from the intimate friendship that God has established with us, God will never forsake us. The covenant is a bond of love between us and God that can never be revoked. God is always faithful to it.

We renew the covenant at every celebration of mass by imaginatively entering into the dying and rising of Jesus, and sharing in his body and blood. He tells us: *This is my body which will be broken on the cross out of love for you. This is my blood of the new and everlasting covenant that will be poured out for you.* We keep repeating the Mass because we keep failing to understand this perfect love. One day we will understand in paradise.

The God of the Bible is not at a distance, watching us like some kind of spy in the sky. God is intimately involved, sharing our pain, tending to us with loving care and rescuing us from our sins and ultimately from death itself. Where is God with human suffering today; yours and the suffering of the world? We know the message of Good Friday, and the unexpected victory of the resurrection. God is in the thick of it all suffering with us, weeping with us, comforting us and healing us. Life itself is our response to God's love affair with each and every one of us. We live it out as joyfully as people in love ought to do.

Our parents may not have been trustworthy. They may not have been involved intimately in our lives. We may have feared, and not revered them. But God is altogether something else! Faithful to his promises, all merciful and all forgiving. God is not frightening, but awesome and awe-inspiring. He is delighted in you. He rejoices over you. He will never forget you. "I have carved you in the palm of my hand."






