

THE EASTER VICTORY: LIFE IS A SHORT TIME IN EXPECTATION OF FUTURE GLORY

"Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised." Mahatma Gandhi had to deal with feelings of discouragement and hopelessness as

we all do sometimes. But he makes clear in his writings that he was a man of hope. He believed that the nonviolent army that he had called together to free the people of India from British rule, would succeed in its efforts. He wrote that when he feels hopeless and despairing, he remembers that through all history, the way of truth and love has won. Although murderers and tyrants seem invincible, (think of Hitler and Stalin) in the end they always fall - always!

The resurrection of Christ we celebrate this season confirms our hopes and longings. The great enemy death has been overcome by the power of God, and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus, the man of hope, trusted that his Father would bring the victory even though everything and everyone turned against him. The joyful cries that met him and his followers on the way up to Jerusalem and the Jewish Temple, cries of "Hosanna to the son of David"; quickly turned in just a few days to "Crucify him, crucify him!"

The gospel writers offer us little detail on the physical sufferings he endured. More significant for the destruction of Jesus was the total abandonment he experienced emotionally and spiritually - the loneliness of the crucifixion. Like all of us, he had a dream that he nurtured. He came to show us how to live authentic lives. He was not sent by his Father to die a horrible death. That would make God into a masochist of the highest order. What father would do that to his son? No, Jesus was sent in order to confirm the heart of the Torah, the Old Testament message given in the

books of the Bible and the testimony of the Jewish prophets. That message was one of saving love.

Since the beginnings of the human race, the creation account makes clear in the story of Adam and Eve turning away from the Lord God, we had misused and abused our God-given freedom. The destructive forces of evil had been let loose in the world as human beings made in God's image and likeness, had turned to acts of war and hate.

In response, God keeps sending wise messengers - holy men and women to alert us to our sinfulness. Finally, he sends the greatest of the prophets, Jesus of Nazareth, to make his love for us crystal clear. Jesus preaches and teaches and acts as God would act. His message is one of forgiveness and kindness and compassion and nonviolence. His hope is that his audience, beginning with his Jewish sisters and brothers, and spreading out to non-Jews, would embrace the message. Instead he finds as the great prophets of Israel had found, only rejection and hatred.

You and I will die one day. The masterwork of our lives will end. God's answer to death and evil and suffering is the resurrection. The victory of Christ over death confirms that Jesus was never really alone.

You and I are never really alone. The resurrection of Jesus will be your resurrection and my resurrection! God has the last word; and that word is love. It is now our task, emboldened by the Spirit, to set the world on fire with that love. "Why do you look for the living one among the dead? He is not here but he has been raised!"

Easter joy to you! Alleluia. Father Bruce






